### CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT PREVENTION

**BREAKING PEACES: BABIES HAVE THEIR SAY ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.** Michael Trout. Champaign, IL: Infant-Parent Institute, 2002. VHS, 17 min. + script.

Text read by a child of an adult's best guess at what the pre-nate, baby, or toddler sees, feels, and concludes about domestic violence.

**BUT NAMES CAN HURT FOREVER: A STUDY OF EMOTIONAL ABUSE AND PSYCHOLOGICAL MALTREATMENT.** Produced by Northeast Wisconsin In-School Telecommunications. Green Bay, WI: University of Wisconsin, 1987. VHS, 30 min. + guide.

Emotional and psychological abuse (for example, the systematic belittling, rejecting or ignoring of someone) may leave no outer bruises, but it can be just as devastating as physical abuse. In this tape, professionals discuss the types and outcomes of this kind of abuse, and several adults who grew up with such abuse as children talk about their experiences. Makes the viewer "not only see and hear emotional abuse, but feel it as well."

**CHILD ABUSE: THE PERFECT CRIME.** Presented by Houston Public Television. Alexandria, VA: PBS Video, 1990. VHS, 60 min.

Experts and professionals discuss methods of dealing with child abuse and the legal and social structures associated with it.

**CHILDREN AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.** Evanston, IL: Altschul, 1994. VHS, 16 min.

Mothers who are abused and the effects of such abuse on their children.

**THE CHILDREN ARE WATCHING.** Evanston, IL: Altschul, 1995. VHS, 12 min.

This 20/20 TV news program segment narrated by Hugh Downs focuses on the children of battered women and the effects that domestic violence has on them, including common behavioral and psychological problems that often appear.

**FAMILY VIOLENCE IN AMERICA: THE POWER WITHIN.** Evanston, IL: Altschul, 1995. 3 VHS, 22 min. videocassettes.

Hosted by Art Linkletter and featuring Jane Middleton-Moz, this series examines the family's role in perpetuating violence in our culture today and also the family's potential for healing.

**Tape 1. CHILD ABUSE**

Focusing on the whole family of origin, this program addresses generational patterns of family abuse and shows how these patterns set the stage for children to become perpetrators and victims of abuse in later life.

**Tape 2. THE FEAR OF ANGER**

Examines the unhealthy expression of anger and teaches healthy anger management, including positively assertive behaviors, so that family members can replace aggressive behaviors with healthy communication.

**Tape 3. CONFLICT RESOLUTION**

Offers concrete guidelines for conflict resolution within the family, and demonstrates that conflict resolution skills minimize the possibilities for violence.

**HELPING BABIES FROM THE BENCH: USING THE SCIENCE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT IN COURT.** Washington, DC: Zero To Three, 2007. **DVD**, 19 min.

By applying the science of early childhood development to decision making, judges can break the cycle of maltreatment that plagues families involved in the child welfare system.

**MAKE A DIFFERENCE: REPORT CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT.** (Indiana's Child Care Collection.) Washington, DC: NAEYC, 1996. VHS or **DVD**, 22 min.

The harsh reality of child abuse and neglect is discussed with professionals who share information regarding the indicators of abuse and neglect, what to do if abuse is suspected, and policies you can put in place to decrease the chance of abuse.

**PROTECTIVE BEHAVIORS FOR CHILDREN: A GUIDE FOR PARENTS.** By Natalie Aikins and Keli Meyer. Produced by the Madison Police Department and Citicable 12. Madison, WI: City of Madison, 1994. VHS, 26 min. + booklet + fact sheets.

Describes the Student Anti Victimization Education (SAVE) program taught in Madison schools by the Madison Police Department. Tells parents and caregivers why not to teach "stranger danger" or "good touch, bad touch" and what to teach instead to help prevent child sexual abuse.

**STRANGER DANGER: HOW TO TEACH KIDS ABOUT STRANGER SAFETY.** Charleston, WV: Cambridge Educational, 1994. VHS, 25 min.

Show parents and care givers: how to teach safety rules to children; how to help children recognize who is or isn't a stranger; where to instruct children to find safety zones if they are scared or in danger; and how to prepare children to become streetwise to potentially dangerous situations.

**TEACHER'S PROGRAM FOR "LITTLE BEAR".** Green Bay, WI: Northeastern Wisconsin In-School Telecommunications (NEWIST/CESA 7) and Bridgework Theater, 1985. VHS, 30 min. + teacher's guide.

Gives background on child sexual abuse and demonstrates how to introduce the video **Little Bear** (described in the children's section of this list) and conduct follow-up discussion with children age 4-11 in ways that teach them how to apply safety concepts in specific real life situations.

**WHAT DO I SAY NOW? : HOW TO HELP PROTECT YOUR CHILD FROM SEXUAL ABUSE.** Seattle, WA: Committee for Children, 1995. VHS, 30 min.

To help their children be safer from sexual abuse, this tape says parents should know about the people in the child's various environments, they should teach their children rules about touching behavior, and they should talk to their children and keep open lines of communication.

**CRYING... WHAT CAN I DO? (NEVER SHAKE A BABY.** Groveport, OH: SBS Prevention Plus, 1992. VHS, 8 min.

This tape about Shaken Baby Syndrome discusses the dangers of shaking babies and various strategies for coping with crying infants.

**INFANT CRYING.** Ogden, UT: National Center on Shaken Baby Syndrome, 199?. Audiocassette or **compact disc**, 5 min.

Five minutes of infant crying to use in trainings on Shaken Baby Syndrome.

**NEVER SHAKE A BABY! : WHAT PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS NEED TO KNOW.** Ottawa: Kiwanis Club, 1998. VHS or **DVD**, 18 min. + 2 fact sheets.

Promotes SBS prevention through education, coping strategies, and careful child care provider selection.

**NEW YORK LOVES SAFE BABIES: HELPFUL STRATEGIES FOR KEEPING INFANTS AND YOUNG CHILDREN SAFE.** Rensselaer, NY: New York State Children and Family Trust Fund/New York State Office of Children & Family Services, 2006. **DVD**, 30 min.

Personal stories illustrate the consequences of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) and Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), including Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS). Gives parents tips for preventing and reducing the risk of child injuries and tragedies. Appropriate for other caregivers such as grandparents, child care providers, babysitters, and non-custodial parents.

**PORTRAIT OF PROMISE: PREVENTING SHAKEN BABY SYNDROME.** English version; updated. St. Paul, MN: Midwest Children's Resource Center at Children's Health Care, 2005. VHS or **DVD**, 11 min.

A nationally recognized child abuse specialist addresses the injuries that can occur if a baby or young child is violently shaken by a parent or caregiver who reacts in anger and frustration to the infant's inconsolable crying. The PowerPoint can either be projected from a computer onto a wall using an LCD projector, or printed in the form of handouts or overheads.
