**News Media Release Child and Adult Care Food Program (“At-Risk” After School Care Center Component) Sponsors (FFY 2012)**

Regulations require that sponsors annually make available to the media a public release announcing the availability of free meals to all enrolled children (no separate charge is imposed) without regard to race, sex, color, disability, age, or national origin, and the procedure for filing a complaint. It does not have to be printed or broadcast; you need only make it available to the news media.

The Child and Adult Care Food Program receives funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction. The meals and snacks served meet standards set by USDA. Meals are provided at no separate charge, and are available to all children without regard to race, sex, color, disability, age, or national origin.

The amount of reimbursement received by the Child and Adult Care Food Program Sponsor (“At-Risk” After School Care Center Component) is based upon the “free” rate of CACFP reimbursement.
