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21st Century Skills in the Arts

We are 15 years into the 21st century. A fascinating aspect of our work as educators is that we are constantly learning how we learn. Within research and practice, the field is sharing some incredible developments in learning and brain

theories. Effective instructional practice highlights the need for multiple learning strategies, embedded meaningful feedback and assessments, as well as resources that effectively support engagement with the concepts.

In addition to these highlights, we have 21st century skills which focus on communication, critical thinking skills, creativity, and collaboration. These skills provide means of exploring the arts and all content areas. A resource for investigating these skills was



developed in 2010, the <u>21st</u> <u>Century Skills Map—The Arts</u>. Check the resource to investigate the skills and see the examples provided, along with the <u>additional resources</u> for practice. The map shares how the arts (art, dance, media arts, music, and theatre) can

utilize the 21st century skills and build student knowledge while potentially fusing with other content areas.
