## **Arts Standards**

The National Coalition for Core Arts Standards has released the conceptual framework for the areas of dance, music, theatre, visual arts, and media arts. The writing teams, made up of dance, music, visual arts, media, and theater representatives, have been utilizing the "Understanding by Design" (UbD) approach to curriculum development and have worked to link to artistic processes in grades preK-8. 

#### Eight Steps to Building Arts Knowledge through Literacy

Steps to build the arts through literacy are provided within the <u>Tip Sheet</u> and within each Fine Arts Disciplinary Literacy website. To better understand these steps, consider using the <u>Template</u> for a few lesson ideas in your planning.



#### **DL Tools in the Arts Overview**

Disciplinary Literacy (DL) involves all content areas. DL is connected directly to the national pursuit and building of foundational skills and knowledge for students. The Common Core focus is one that for technical areas such as the arts is pursued through a focus on Disciplinary Literacy. The intent of DL in Wisconsin is not to abandon arts standards or have arts areas adopt another content area set of standards, but instead to utilize literacy

and the DL tools to explore arts concepts more fully. Learners have a variety of ways to show their knowledge with several different types of informational text features. More discussion of the types of informational text is provided below, along with examples of DL use in the arts classroom. A description of what DL is and is not, is available within the Tip Sheet.

## **Informational Text**

Literacy has varying functions based on the specific experiences and technical knowledge of a content area. The arts use a variety of images, auditory, and visual text features that offer the learner information to create meaning. The type of informational "text" used within the arts can be, but is not restricted to the following:

- Music Notes
- Choreography Notation
- Art Images
- Script Notation
- Stage Cues
- Art Critiques
- Sound Cues
- Podcasts
