### **Key Details**

- Key details that support the main ideas
- The who, what when, where, why, how much, or how many
- Nuances in meaning

#### **Vocabulary and Text Structure**

- Literal and inferential meanings
- Denotation and connotation
- Figurative language
- How organization contributes to meaning

#### **Author's Purpose**


- Purpose: Entertain? Inform? Persuade?
- Point of View: 1<sup>st</sup> person, 3<sup>rd</sup> person limited/omniscient, un/reliable narrator
- Critical Literacy: Who's story is not represented?

#### Inference

- Probe each argument in persuasive texts\*
- Probe each idea in informational texts\*
- Probe each key detail in literary texts\*
- \* Observe how these build to a whole
