WPCP Facts and Figures for 2016-2017 As of December 2017

In January 2017, there were 121 private schools participating in the WPCP, with a total enrollment of 3,032 students or 2,966.4 full-time equivalent (FTE) in the program.* In the 2016-17 school year, the WPCP state aid for a student enrolled full-time in the WPCP in grade kindergarten through eight is \$7,323 and \$7,969 for a student enrolled full-time in grade nine through twelve.

2015 Act 55 (Wisconsin 2015-17 Biennial Budget) changed the manner in which the WPCP is funded. Students that participated in the program prior to the 2015-16 school year will continue to be fully funded from state general purpose revenue. Pupils who begin attending a private school under the WPCP in the 2015-16 school year and thereafter are referred to as "incoming pupils." All choice pupils participating in the WPCP must identify their resident public school district (the public school district where they reside on the 3rd Friday in September). Wisconsin public school districts will have their state general aid reduced by an amount equal to the amount paid by the state to participating private schools attributable to the incoming pupils residing in the district.

If the resident public school district does not receive an equalization aid payment sufficient to cover the incoming choice pupil aid reduction, the balance would be reduced from other state aid received by the district. Incoming pupils in the WPCP are included in their resident public school district's membership for state general aid purposes in the following year. Districts may not levy to backfill the aid reduction. School districts receive a non-recurring revenue limit exemption equal to the number of FTE choice students multiplied by the current year revenue limit per student. For the 2016-17 school year, no more than 1% of pupils residing in a public school district may participate in the WPCP. There were 3,853 students eligible to be included in the statutorily required random drawing conducted by the department in July for districts with more applications than the 1% limit or for schools with more applicants than seats available. There were 494 students remaining on the waiting lists and 260 students who chose not to participate in the program. The department is required to fill a seat from a district's waiting list if a choice student leaves a school and the choice enrollment falls below the 1% limit.

Table 1 shows the WPCP enrollment by grade level. The number of students listed in the table is reported by headcount and FTE. For example, a four-year-old kindergarten student may be counted as 0.5 or 0.6 FTE.
