

School Nurse Certification Program

The UW–Madison School of Nursing offers the School Nurse Certification program in cooperation with the School of Education. The program prepares nurses for positions overseeing school health services. Prospective students must have their bachelor’s degree in nursing and registered nurse (RN) license to enter the certification program. Students enrolled in either UW–Madison’s baccalaureate nursing program or BSN@Home program are also eligible. A program application is necessary and certification requires a minimum of four courses plus a practicum (or equivalent experience). Upon completion of the program, candidates apply to obtain Wisconsin School Nurse Certification from the Department of Public Instruction.
