The New Wisconsin School Mental Health Framework:

How does the framework impact your work as a statelevel partner?

- It provides state partners structures and tools to align and integrate their work to advance educational and health equity.
- It provides common language for messaging connections between mental health work already happening in schools.
- It outlines an integrated approach, which can help partners reduce duplication and inefficiency in services and supports.
- It encourages schools and districts to approach mental health as a community asset that relies on connections to local and state-level resources and supports.
- It focuses on sustainability and emphasizes the ways that local and statelevel partners can contribute to the longevity of the system.

What can you do to advance the new school mental health framework in your role?
