- _4_ Roll the person into recovery position and monitor until EMS arrives
- _5_ Report administration of naloxone to administrator/program coordinator per district policy
- _1_ Determine if the person is conscious or unresponsive – shake, shout, sternal rub
- _3_ Simultaneously follow emergency response (CPR/ Rescue Breaths for an unresponsive victim and if suspected overdose GIVE NALOXONE
