



# **Calculating Percent Choice Enrollment**

School and District Report Cards

#### Introduction

This document provides a detailed description of the Percent Choice Enrollment statistic found in the *Private School – Choice Students* and *Private School – All Students* report cards. This number is located under "School Details" on the front page of these report cards to let stakeholders know the percentage of enrolled students at a private school who participate in a Private School Choice Program.

#### **Data Sources**

The data used to calculate Percent Choice Enrollment for report cards come from two sources: the <u>PI-1207 Private School Report</u> and the **WISEdata Third Friday of September Choice Participant Count.** 

Please note that it is not possible to use WISEdata as the source for verifying enrollment counts of all students at private schools, because only the schools that have elected to receive the optional <a href="Private School - All Students report card">Private School - All Students report card</a> report data on all (Choice and non-Choice) private school students via WISEdata. The official <a href="Private School Choice Programs">Private School Choice Programs</a> counts are also not used for all private student enrollment because these counts are aggregated across schools in cases where schools have enrolled in the Choice Program as a group.

## PI-1207 Private School Report

The PI-1207 Private School Report is the official count of all students enrolled in private schools across the state. Every private school in Wisconsin (Choice or non-Choice) is required to submit the enrollment counts for each grade via the PI-1207 by October 15 of each year (Wis. Stat. Sec. 115.30(3) and 118.165(1)). Pre-K students at the school are subtracted from the PI-1207 count, because Pre-K is not part of the Choice program. The remaining students count as the base student population in the Percent Choice Enrollment calculation.

#### WISEdata Third Friday of September Choice Participant Count

Choice schools provide enrollment information for Choice students in **WISEdata** that are collected during the **Third Friday of September** (TFS) data snapshot. The DPI uses the TFS snapshot as a static source of student data for the school information box on the front page of report cards. The number of Choice students reported in WISEdata as of the TFS snapshot is divided by the overall student population from the PI-1207 report (described above) to calculate Percent Choice Enrollment.

Please note that any data snapshotted with errors will impact the accuracy of the Percent Choice Enrollment displayed on the report card. This will in turn lead to discrepancies between the percentage reported on the report card compared to the percentage reported by the <a href="Private">Private</a> School Choice Program data.



# **Calculating Percent Choice**

The PI-1207 Private School Report is used for the base student population at private schools and supplies the denominator for percent choice calculation. The data reported by Choice schools on their Choice student population via WISEdata supplies the numerator for this calculation. The percent choice enrollment displayed on the report card is calculated by dividing the count of choice participant students by the count of all enrolled students:

$$Percent\ Choice\ Enrollment\ = \frac{Choice\ Participant\ Count\ (WISEdata)}{All\ Enrolled\ Count\ (PI-1207)}$$

## Percent Choice Walkthrough #1

Sample Private Elementary is a PreK-5 school with **25 Choice students** reported in the WISEdata TFS snapshot and the following student enrollment counts in the PI-1207 Private School Report:

Grade	Female Students	Male Students	Total Students
PK	5	5	10
KG	12	10	22
1	9	12	21
2	10	6	16
3	7	13	20
4	12	12	24
5	9	13	22
TOTAL	64	71	135

This school has 10 Pre-K students that, as noted above, will need to be subtracted from the percent choice calculation because Pre-K is not part of the Choice program:

135 total students - 10 Pre-K students = 125 students for Percent Choice calculation

Now that we have removed Pre-K students, we can calculate Percent Choice by dividing the number of choice students reported in WISEdata (25) by the number of remaining students in from the PI-1207 report (125):

$$\frac{25}{125} = 0.2$$

Sample Private Elementary has a 20% choice enrollment.



# Percent Choice Walkthrough #2

Sample Private High School is a grade 9-12 school with **208 Choice students** reported in the WISEdata snapshot and the following student enrollment counts in the PI-1207 Private School Report:

Grade	Female Students	Male Students	Total Students
9	73	80	153
10	80	83	163
11	89	75	164
12	88	82	170
TOTAL	330	320	650

This school does not have any Pre-K students, so we can calculate Percent Choice Enrollment by dividing the number of choice students reported in WISEdata (208) by the total number of students from the PI-1207 report (650):

$$\frac{208}{650} = 0.32$$

Sample Private High School has 32% choice enrollment.
