


Linking to School and District Report Cards from the DPI Report Card Portal

1. Navigate to the Wisconsin DPI School and District Report Card Portal by clicking this link: <https://apps6.dpi.wi.gov/reportcards/>.
2. Select Public or Private (see **highlight** below). *Public includes report cards for public schools, districts, and charter schools. Private includes report cards for choice program schools.*

3. Next, select the School Year of the school and district report cards (see **highlight** above). *The School Year of the most recently available report card will be the default School Year. These screenshots were taken in August 2025 so the most recently available report cards were 2023-24 report cards. Report cards for a given school year are typically released in November of the next school year.*

4. Depending on whether Public or Private was selected above:

For Public, use the dropdown box to search for or select the Name of District (see **highlight** below).

For Private, use the dropdown box to search for or select the Name of the Private School (see **highlight** below). The Private School's name will appear first followed by a dash and then the city the Private School is located in.

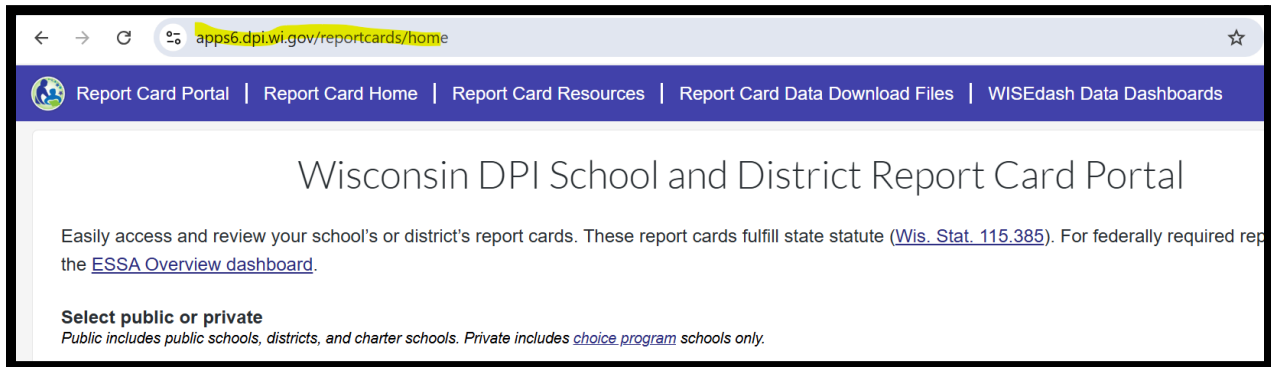

6. A unique link for the report cards for a given school or district will be produced in the address bar (see **highlight** below for where that unique link will appear; the link will start with apps6.dpi.wi.gov/reportcards). Schools and districts can now use that link to direct individuals to their report cards on the Report Card Application. This may be particularly useful in helping to meet the report card notification requirements.



7. Double-check the unique link works and includes the intended school and district report cards by copying and pasting the link into a blank address bar (see image below).
