

# PREVIEW REPORTS AT-A-GLANCE

## OPTIONAL STATEMENT <sup>1</sup>

In the future, schools and districts will have the option to submit a statement that will appear in the top left corner of report cards. Placeholder text appears in the preview reports.

## NO OVERALL SCORE OR RATING <sup>3</sup>

There is no overall score, nor is there an associated rating or number of stars (out of five) in the preview reports. Preview reports do not contain overall scores or ratings but future report cards will.

## PRIORITY AREA SCORES <sup>5</sup>

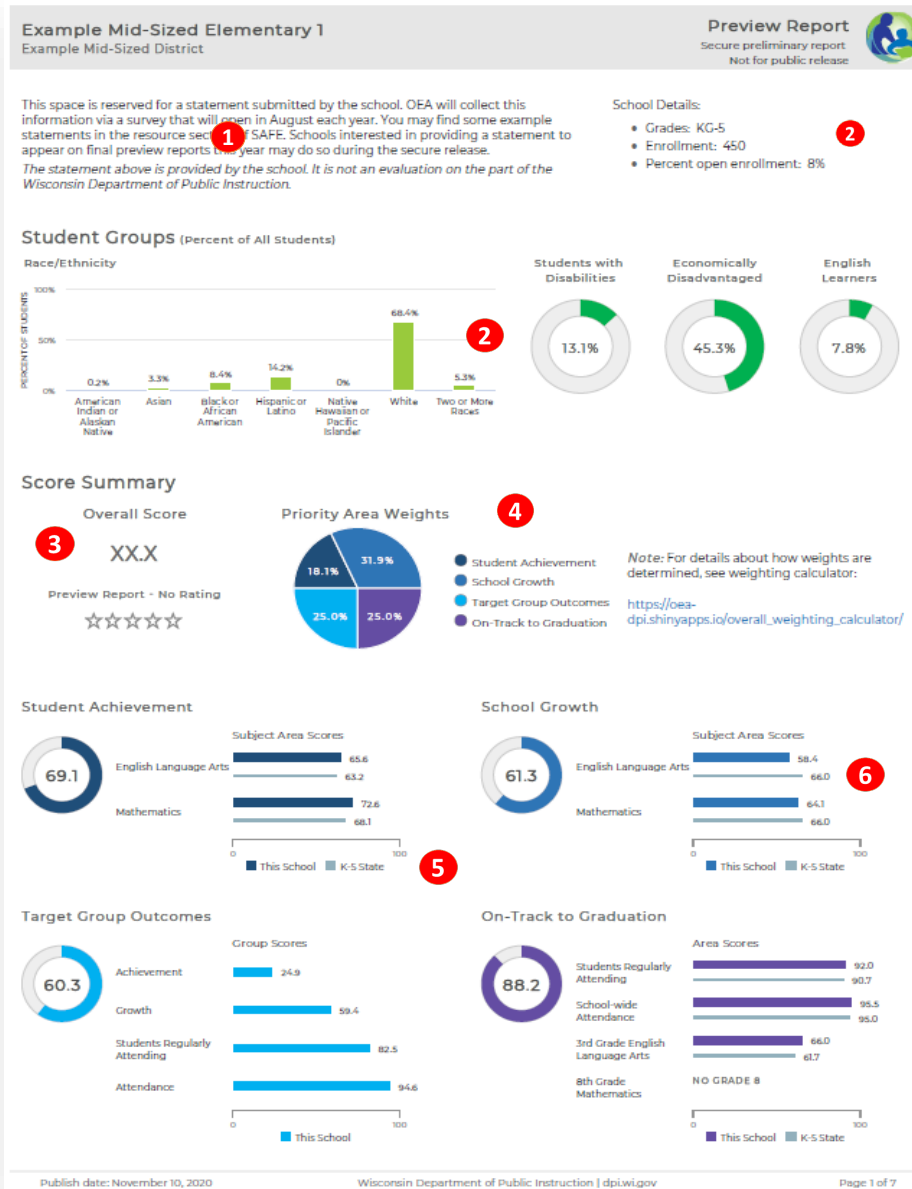
On the bottom of the page, scores are provided for the four priority areas, along with a comparison bar showing the state average for the grade span most similar to the school.

**Student Achievement:** students' level of knowledge and skills attained compared against state academic standards in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics.

**Growth:** how rapidly students are gaining knowledge and skills from year to year, focusing on the pace of improvement in students' performance.

**Target Group Outcomes:** outcomes for students with the lowest test scores in their school - the Target Group. Outcomes are displayed for achievement, growth, regular attendance, and attendance or graduation rate.

**On-Track to Graduation:** how successfully students are achieving educational milestones that predict later success.



## SCHOOL/DISTRICT INFORMATION <sup>2</sup>

School or district information is provided towards the top of the preview reports. These descriptive data, including the grade span, student demographics, enrollment count, and (for public schools/districts) percent of students who were open-enrolled or (for choice schools) the percent of students participating in the choice program, provide important context for reviewing the preview report.

## ACCOUNTABILITY WEIGHTING <sup>4</sup>

Next to the space for the overall score is a pie chart displaying the weighting used when calculating overall scores. The weighting for Student Achievement and School/District Growth varies depending on the percent of economically disadvantaged (ECD) students in the school. ## STATE COMPARISON DATA <sup>6</sup>

The priority area sections on the front page include state comparison bars, which are colored gray. For schools, comparisons are based on one of six broad grade bands: K-5, K-8, K-12, 6-8, 6-12, and 9-12. State scores are given for comparison purposes only and do not factor into the accountability scores or ratings.

## COURSE DATA

Preview reports for public schools/districts with grades 9-12 contain arts and postsecondary preparation course data on subsequent pages (not on the front page). Data is from the 2018-19 WISEdata Year-End Snapshot.
