


Welcome to Xello! You'll be using the resources on the Xello platform through middle and high school as you start thinking about and planning for your future career. Follow the directions below to log into Xello and personalize your Xello page.

1. Log into Xello - go to https://xello.world/en/ and click the "Sign In" button in the upper right-hand corner. Once you enter your username and password, click the "About Me" button on the top of the Xello screen in the middle:



You'll notice that you don't have a picture in either in the profile picture box or in the banner. Upload a profile picture and cover photo by clicking on the camera icon in these boxes and uploading a picture to each.



Lesson 3: My interests



So, what do you like to do? Play basketball? Cook? Read? Sometimes our interests can help us determine our future careers. Today you'll have the opportunity to add some of your interests to your Xello page.

- 1. Log into Xello go to https://xello.world/en/ and click the "Sign In" button in the upper right-hand corner. Once you enter your username and password, click the "About Me" button on the top of the Xello screen in the middle.
- 2. Interests Scroll down the "About Me" page until you get to the "Interests" box in the middle of the screen:



Once you click on it, you'll get some suggestions in the middle of the screen:



As you select each Interests Category, you'll get a lot of suggestions for activities and interests for each. If you click on an activity or interest, it will pop up to the top of the box. If you click on the "x" next to the title in the list, it will delete itself.



Spend some time clicking through the suggested interests. If you can't find an interest you have, you can add it in the "Add an Interest" box at the top of the screen. Once you are done adding interests in one Interest Category, click the "Done" button in the upper right-hand corner. You should now see those interests pop up in the Interest box on your "About Me" screen. You need to save AT LEAST 5 interests to your Xello "About Me" page.

Lesson 4: Career Exploration


Learning Targets:


Directions:

Today you'll be using Xello to start doing some career exploration. Xello has a number of filters which will help you narrow down careers you might be interested in.


1. Careers – Next to "About Me," click on "Explore Options," and then select "Careers" on the left side of the screen:




- 2. On the "Explore Careers" screen, you can start setting some filters to find careers:
 - Choose a minimum salary by moving the slider. In the U.S., the current minimum wage is \$7.25 per hour, which equals \$15,080 as a full-time annual salary.



- Decide if you want more education by clicking on "High School," "Two-Year College," or "Four-Year College" (or more than one).
- If you'd like more options, you can click on "More Filters," which will allow you to select careers by Career Demand, Career Clusters, and School Subjects:



3. Once you've selected your filters, scroll down and find THREE careers that you might be interested in, open each career, and click on the "Save" heart on the right side under the picture.




In this activity, you will identify how time management is an important skill for one saved career. Then add and rate this skill and six time management strategies within your profile.

2. Click on one of your saved careers.


At the top of the profile of that career, choose an emoji to indicate how you feel about this career.



Lesson 11: Research Company Profiles (Optional Inspire Lesson)

Learning Targets:


- I can find a company which employs people in one of my career interest areas

Directions:

It's great to know which careers align with your skills and interests. But where will you find a job in one of these career fields? Do you know businesses in your community or state which have employees doing the kind of work you are interested in? In this activity, you will have the opportunity to get find some employers which hire for your career interests and do a little research into these companies.


Once you're logged into Xello, go to your Saved Careers.
 Remember to find your Saved Careers by clicking on the ♥ in the upper right-hand corner.
 That will take you to "My Saved Options." Here you'll be able to see everything that you've saved as favorites.




2. Click on one of your saved careers. If you haven't already, at the top of the profile of that career, choose an emoji to indicate how you feel about this career.



3. Now, scroll past the Job Description until you get to two boxes: Huddles and Companies. Click on the "Let's Go!" under Companies.



You will see a new page called "Explore Companies" at the top of the screen, you will see that the companies have been screened for your career choice. If there are no companies which employ your first career choice, type a new career in the "Career" box until you see some companies. For example, there may not be any companies when searching for "Anthropologist," but there are 164 companies who hire "Accountants"!



You can also apply additional filters. If you are looking for a specific company, you can type it in the "Company" box. If you are searching for companies in your city or town, you can try typing in thee "City" box which will then search by cities. Or you can just scroll down and see how many companies align with your career of interest.

Take some time to select some companies and skim the information found there. There are almost 1,400 Wisconsin companies in the system right now, with more adding all the time. Find a company that has a "Careers at the Company" section at the bottom of the screen.
