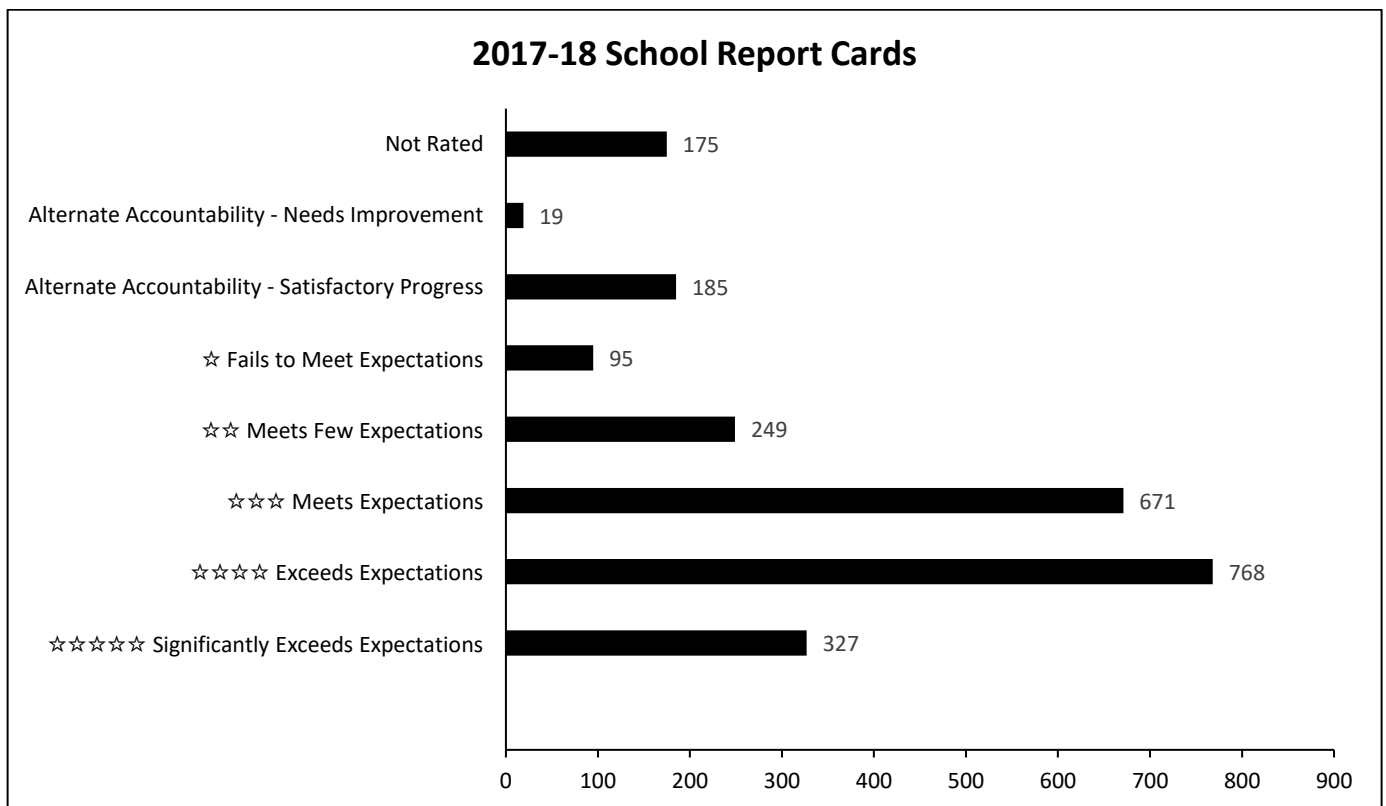
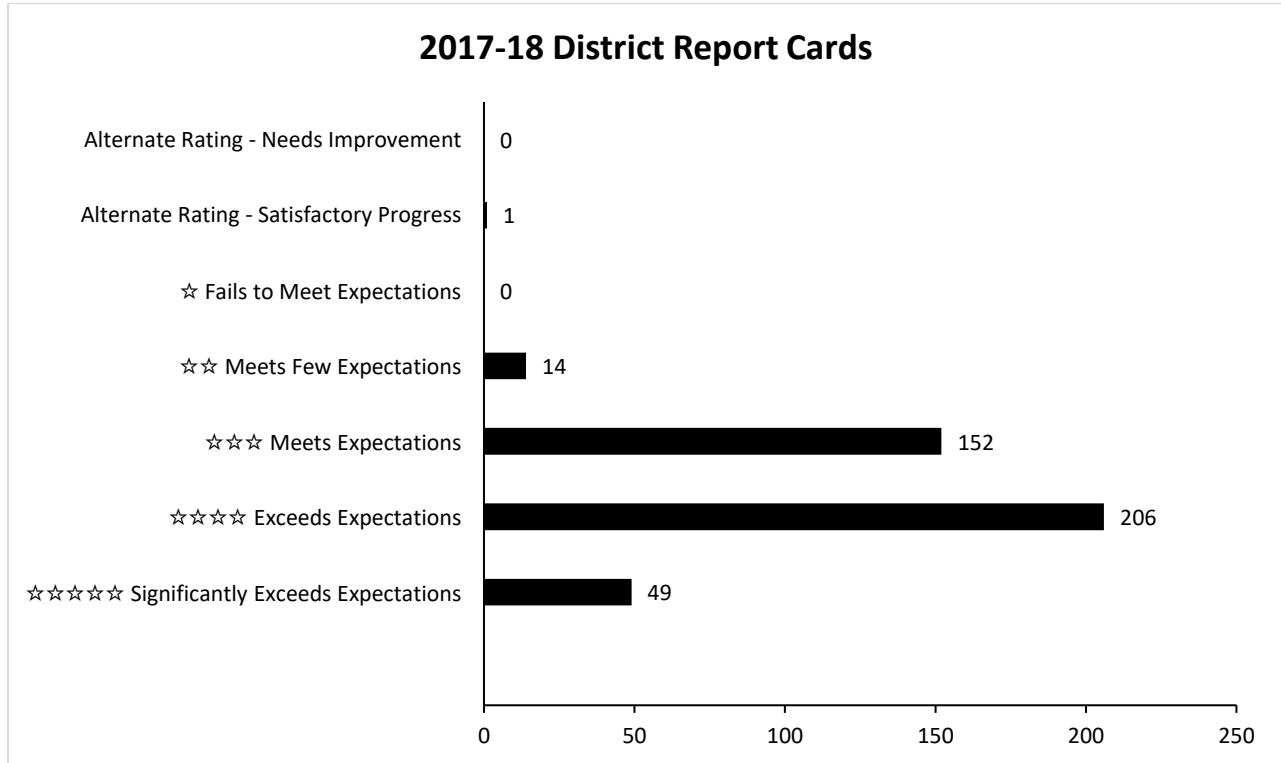


2017-18 Accountability Report Card Summary

On the School Report Cards for the 2017-18 school year, 84% of schools meet, exceeded or significantly exceeded expectations, up from 82% last year. While the majority of schools received a score and rating on the report card, 7% of schools were not rated due to insufficient data. Another 8% fell into the Alternate Accountability process, receiving alternate ratings.



At the district level, 96% of districts met, exceeded or significantly exceeded expectations.



Of those scored, 6% of Schools Report Cards and 2% of District Report Cards were considered outliers for change compared to last year's overall accountability score. Outliers are defined as those with an overall score change of +/-10 points or more, as compared to the 2016-17 overall scores, and represented by ^ at the end of their rating category.

The number of deductions for the Student Engagement Indicators – Absenteeism Rate and Dropout Rate – have increased over the past five report card years, especially those for Absenteeism. At the school level, 125 schools received a five point deduction due to a problem of chronic absenteeism in the school. There were 13 dropout deductions this year.
