**Subject:** [actwisconsin] ACT student score reports - Please read

DPI is getting numerous emails and phone calls from school counselors and others regarding ACT student reports. Please review the information that was posted in the ACT Wisconsin Newsletter which was mailed the week of March 16<sup>th</sup> and is posted at: <http://oea.dpi.wi.gov/sites/default/files/imce/oea/pdf/ACTnewsletter3-17-15.pdf.pdf>.

A summary of this and additional information is included below, but please refer to the newsletter for more complete information.

- Students will receive their printed score reports delivered to their home address 3-8 weeks after testing.
- This is a rolling release. There is no single day that all of your students will receive their reports. With 67,000 Wisconsin students and a total of 700,000 students testing nationally on March 3<sup>rd</sup>, scores reports will be mailed as they are available during this 3-8 week time frame.
- Wisconsin students have started to receive their score reports and some schools have received their first batch of school reports.
- Students can log on to [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org) to access a variety of services through an ACT web account. If a student needs to create a new account, the student must enter the ACT ID from the printed score report to view the state scores. Scores will be available online about one week after the examinee receives the printed score report in the mail.
- During this same 3-8 week period schools will receive a shipment of the ACT High School Check List Report (a list of examinees included in the school's shipment), ACT High School Reports (student level score data), and ACT Student Score Labels (for placement on permanent records). These will be sent in batches until all are received.
- Some students have received electronic notifications from colleges that the college has received the student's ACT scores. These are colleges that the student authorized ACT to release scores to. This may be happening before the student has received the paper score report from ACT. DPI has been told by ACT that colleges independently contract with ACT to receive electronic uploads of student scores as they become available. These contracts vary from college to college and some contract for very frequent uploads during peak testing times so they can stay current on student score data. DPI is not able to interfere with the contractual agreement between the colleges and ACT in terms of their data upload schedule.
- The ACT Profile Report-High School (paper) and ACT Profile Report - District (CD) that aggregate data for the high school and district, including students tested using state-allowed accommodations, is scheduled to arrive by June 25th.

Your cooperation and patience is greatly appreciated. Please know that DPI is not able to accelerate this process for individual students and schools. DPI is very pleased that students and parents are so excited and anxious to receive the ACT score reports and appreciates your effort to channel that enthusiasm in positive ways.
