# Reminder:

#### **Verify Student Data**

DPI will load student data from WISEdata into the DRC INSIGHT Portal (Forward) and PearsonAccessed (ACT with writing and PreACT Secure). To ensure that you have the correct roster of students for testing, please make certain that your student enrollment and demographic data are correct in WISEdata before the **end of the day on January 25**.

# Accountability

### New:

#### 2023-24 JFN Preliminary Release

The preliminary release of the Joint Federal Notification (JFN) packets is planned for **late-February 2024**. This release will include preliminary versions of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) accountability reports. The specific date of the release will be announced in a future DAC Digest.

As a reminder, this new timeline differs from years past, in which the preliminary JFN release typically took place in December. Please see the <u>December 6 DAC Digest</u> for more information on this updated timeline.

# **Reminders:**

### Test Window Closing

The ACCESS for ELLs test window will close on **Friday**, **February 2**. Please ensure that all students have completed all sections of the assessment by the end of that school day.



#### Materials

All materials are due back to DRC on or before Tuesday, February 13. Please ensure that UPS picks up your materials by Friday, February 9 to meet this deadline.

# ACT

### New:

#### Verify Student Rosters in PearsonAccessert - January 29-31

On January 26, DPI will load school ACT student rosters into <u>PearsonAccessed</u>. Testing staff will have from **January 29-31** to verify that student enrollment is correct and indicate testing mode for each student (paper or online). DPI and ACT will send out detailed instructions via email on how to complete this task. Instructions and resources can also be found under <u>Step 2, Configuration: Verify Enrollment</u> <u>Counts on the Wisconsin ACT webpage</u>.

#### Accommodations Reconsideration Deadline - February 2

The reconsideration deadline for accommodations and English learner supports is February 2. This deadline applies to **reconsideration requests only**. If you have an initial request where ACT has issued a decision notification that requires further review, please submit the request for reconsideration no later than February 2. #### Educator Involvement Opportunity

DPI is recruiting a diverse group of Wisconsin educators to establish cut scores for the ACT in English Language Arts (ELA), Mathematics and Science. These cut scores are independent of ACT's College and Career Readiness Benchmarks and are used for state accountability. The Standard Setting will be an inperson, two-day meeting held in Madison on July 10-11, 2024. # **PreACT Secure**

# New:

#### **Student Roster Upload**

DPI will load PreACT Secure student rosters into PAnext on January 26. On January 29, schools can begin verifying rosters and assigning accommodations. DPI and ACT will send out detailed instructions via email on how to complete these tasks the week of January 29. #### PreACT Secure - Test Administration #1 Training Webinar

#### PearsonAccessnext Opened January 22

On January 22, the PreACT Secure portal opened within <u>PearsonAccessed</u> (PAnext) for the spring 2024 administration. DACs have access through the assessment drop down menu using their existing PAnext account credentials. DACs will need to create accounts and grant user access to the PreACT Secure portal for all testing staff. Instructions on how to create accounts and/or update existing accounts can be found in the <u>PersonAccessed</u> User Guide for the PreACT Secure.

- Complete First Contact Surveys and Personal Needs and Preference Profiles

# **Forward Exam**

### New:

### Forward Exam Q&A webinar

On February 7 at 12:30 pm, the second of three optional Q&A webinar sessions will take place (see the <u>Forward Exam Calendar webpage</u> for third Q&A webinar date). This webinar is an opportunity for District and School Assessment Coordinators (DACs/SACs) and District and School Technology Coordinators (DTCs/STCs) to ask DPI and DRC staff questions about Forward Exam test set-up, administration, or technology that may have come up after reviewing the training videos and other resources. ### ELA Test Design and Short Write Tasks Information and FAQ

We appreciate the questions from Districts regarding the new ELA test design and short write tasks. These topics are discussed in detail in the DAC/SAC Training and the Test Administrator Trainings available on the <u>Forward Exam Trainings webpage</u>. There is also a handout available on the <u>Forward Exam</u> <u>Resources webpage</u> that explains the changes and provides answers to common questions about the short write tasks. Share this handout with your educators. We have also included the short write task FAQs on the <u>Forward Exam Frequently Asked Questions webpage</u>. DRC is currently creating the rubrics for these new item types. OEA will notify DACs as soon as draft rubrics are available and posted to the Forward Exam Resources webpage. Rubrics will not be finalized until the <u>ELA Rangefinding meeting</u> in April.

### **Optional Add Accessibility Features Window Begins February 12**

During this optional window (February 12-23), districts may use the Multiple Student Upload process to upload designated supports and accommodations for multiple students at one time into the DRC INSIGHT Portal. This two-week optional window is the only time this method of uploading accessibility features is available. As a reminder, Text-to-Speech is now a Universal Support for all students and does not need to be assigned in the Portal. If you choose not to take advantage of the window, you may still enter supports and accommodations into the DRC INSIGHT Portal on an individual student or "mass assign" basis as needed, beginning March 4. Instructions for all three processes are available in the <u>DRC INSIGHT Portal Guide</u>.

#### Read Aloud (Human Reader) Accommodation Prior Approval

The Read Aloud **accommodation** is different from the Read Aloud **designated support**. The accommodation is only available to a student with visual impairments who is receiving instruction in contracted braille but not yet proficient, and whose need is documented in an IEP or 504 plan. The student must meet all five criteria on the <u>Request for Read Aloud Accommodation Form for the Forward</u> <u>Exam</u>. If a student requires the Read Aloud accommodation and meets the criteria stated on the form, the



DAC must submit a Request for Read Aloud Accommodation Form to the Office of Educational Accountability. DPI will review the request, and if approved, activate the process. After receiving DPI approval, the DAC must assign the accommodation in the DRC INSIGHT Portal for the student prior to printing test tickets. Students who do not meet all criteria but require Read Aloud (a human reader) should use the Read Aloud designated support.

# **NAEP** and International Assessments

(for schools selected to participate in 2023-24 assessments only)

#### New:

#### NAEP Assessment Window Opens Monday, January 29

The NAEP assessment window opens next week. Each school has one assigned test date in the window of January 29 to March 8, 2024. NAEP School Coordinators should be finalizing the Assessment Planning Tasks in the <u>NAEP Assessment Management nagSystem (AMS)</u>; all tasks need to be completed before the school's test date. NAEP field staff are following up with individual schools to provide support in completing remaining tasks. DACs can review the progress of most of the tasks in the NAEP AMS, but will not have full access to all the tasks unless they are also designated as the School Coordinator. ### **Reminder:**

#### NAEP High School Transcript Study Closes Next Week

The NAEP High School Transcript Study (HSTS) data collection is open in the <u>NAEP Assessment</u> <u>Management System (AMS)</u>. HSTS Coordinators will complete the course catalog submission and the transcript information survey, which are open through **Wednesday**, **January 31**. Please notify <u>Angela</u> <u>Dugas</u> as soon as possible if a high school needs an extension on this deadline. The last step of the HSTS is the student transcript submission which will open in the summer of 2024.
