### **Happy New Year**

Welcome to 2024! Thank you for all of the thoughtful questions and feedback around implementing assessments and accountability in the last year. OEA looks forward to continuing our collaborative work with all of you in the new year.

### **Verify Student Data**

DPI will load student data from WISEdata into the DRC INSIGHT Portal (Forward) and PearsonAccess (ACT with writing and PreACT Secure). To ensure that you have the correct roster of students for testing, please make certain that your student enrollment and demographic data are correct in WISEdata before the end of the day on January 25.

### Reminder:

#### District Assessment Coordinator (DAC) Confidentiality Agreement

DACs from districts administering the ACCESS for ELLs who have not already completed the 2023-24 <u>DAC Confidentiality Agreement</u> should do so now and submit to OEA as soon as possible. The form may be completed electronically and signed electronically using Acrobat Reader. Be sure to read the terms for each assessment and select the appropriate options on the ACT agreement prior to signing. The entire document needs to be submitted to OEA once signed. If your district is not administering the ACCESS for ELLs for 2023-24, be sure to submit your form by March 1. All other confidentiality forms (SACs, DTCs, STCs, etc.) remain individual forms, but may be completed electronically, and once completed are to be retained at the school/district level.

If you have a student transfer into your district from another Wisconsin district, please complete the <u>Student Transfer Request for ACCESS for ELLs form</u>. We will transfer their registration to your district, and the student will not need to be administered any domains they have already completed.

### **Online Testing Site Readiness Service**

This year, ACT will provide Wisconsin schools with an optional Online Testing Site Readiness Service. This helpful service will allow districts to connect directly with an ACT Customer Support Specialist trained in the technical requirements and support of online administration. This service is optional and interested districts will need to opt-in with ACT by **Tuesday**, **January 8**. Additional information and instructions on how to participate was sent to DACs on Monday, December 18. DPI encourages districts to take advantage of this opportunity to ensure they are ready for online testing.

### **Accommodation Requests Reminder**

The deadline to submit requests for spring 2024 testing is **January 19**. DPI strongly encourages schools to **enter requests into the Test Accessibility and Accommodations System (TAA) now** to avoid delays and allow time for reconsideration if needed.

- Submit requests early well before the **January 19 deadline**.
- Refer to <u>Step 3: Accommodation</u>, on the <u>Wisconsin ACT Webpage</u> for accommodation and EL support resources and training.
- Log into the TAA to view status and decisions on accommodations/EL support requests.
  - o If a request is not approved, you can submit again for reconsideration.
  - Reach out to OSA as soon as possible if you are experiencing difficulty receiving an approval for an accommodation.



### Video American Sign Language - Available Spring 2024

ACT is currently working to develop Video American Sign Language (VASL) for all content areas as an authorized accommodation for students with hearing impairments. VASL will be available for spring 2024 testing for both paper and online testing. More information on how VASL will be administered to students will be available early next year. #### 2024 Forward Exam Resources

#### **New Forward Exam Practice Test**

The new Forward Exam Practice Test, for each tested grade and content level, is now available on the <u>Forward Exam Practice Test webpage</u>. All students should be given the opportunity to practice with the online Forward Exam Practice test as new tools and functionality have been included (e.g., Text-to-Speech Universal Tool for all students). <u>Updated Student Tutorials</u> are also now available and should be used in conjunction with the practice test.

### 2024 Forward Exam Trainings

The Forward Exam pre-recorded trainings for District and School Assessment Coordinators (DACs/SACs) and Test Administrators (TAs) will be available January 8 on the <u>Forward Exam Trainings webpage</u>.

- DAC/SAC Training This is a full training required for all DACs/SACs that did not attend the inperson training sessions in November.
- **Test Administrator (TA) Training** This training is required for all TAs and covers all information TAs need to prepare for and administer the Forward Exam. DACs should ensure that all TAs view this training.

### NAEP High School Transcript Study Open Through January 31

The NAEP High School Transcript Study (HSTS) data collection is now open in the <u>NAEP Assessment</u> <u>Management System (AMS)</u>. HSTS Coordinators will complete the course catalog submission and the transcript information survey, which are open through the **end of January**. The last step of the HSTS is the student transcript submission which will open in the summer of 2024.
