Assessment and Accountability

Reminder:

District Assessment Coordinator (DAC) Confidentiality Agreement Due March 1

All DACs who have not yet completed the 2023-24 <u>DAC Confidentiality Agreement</u> should do so no later than March 1. The form may be completed electronically and signed electronically using Acrobat Reader. Be sure to select the appropriate options on the ACT agreement prior to signing. The entire seven-page document needs to be submitted to OEA once signed. All other confidentiality forms (SACs, DTCs, STCs, etc.) remain individual forms, but may be completed electronically, and once completed are to be retained at the school/district level.

Reminder:

Preliminary Joint Federal Notifications

Preliminary joint federal notifications will be available in <u>SAFE, the Secure Access File Exchange</u> on **February 29**. The reports include:

- District Summary Report
- IDEA LEA Determinations
- ESSA Accountability Report
- ESSA Progress to Exit Report for schools with a Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) or Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) identification.

Final reports, including the Racial Equity in Special Education (disproportionality) report, will be released in April 2024.

Please note that preliminary reports should not be shared with the public. In addition, the LEA Determination reports may contain personally identifiable information and should never be shared with the public.

Data Validation Window

The pre-reporting Data Validation window will close February 29. Please check that student names and IDs are correct and ensure that Writing booklets for grades 1-3 were properly matched to the online test sessions. Demographics are sourced from WISEdata, so only the core identifying information needs to be checked at this time.

Do Not Score codes should not be used unless a student should receive no score at all. If these codes are applied to online domains for students taking Alternate ACCESS for ELLs, DRC will not score their booklets.

Important Technology Update: ACT and PreACT Secure

On February 23, ACT released **updates** to the ACT and PreACT Secure Technical Guides for Online Testing. Please check that the <u>Required Version of TestNav</u> has been downloaded and review the <u>Software Requirements for TestNav Section</u> **prior to testing** to ensure you have a compatible version of your operating system. **Please disseminate this information out to all Test and Technical Coordinators**. Accommodations: Pre-Recorded Audio Hyperlinks

ACT will begin emailing Test Window 1 pre-recorded audio hyperlinks and instructions to Test Coordinators on Thursday, February 29. If you do not receive an email by Wednesday, March 6, please reach out to ACT Accommodations at 800-553-6244, ext. 1788.

Newly Enrolled Students - MyACT:

Test Coordinators should verify all new students are enrolled in PearsonAccess and test materials were ordered. Once the new students are rostered, the Test Coordinator will need to create individualized Non-Test Instructions for Students Forms and provide students with a printed copy of Taking the ACT. Instructions on how to create the Non-Test Instruction Form and guidance on the MyACT registration process is outlined in the MyACT User Guide for Test Coordinators. Additional MyACT resources can be found under Step 4 of the Wisconsin ACT Website.

Additional Materials Order - Deadline

The last day to order additional materials for **Test Window 1 is March 1**. Test Coordinators should:

- Verify all students received materials for testing.
- Verify receipt of Online Testing Materials Return Kit if testing online.

Late Consideration for Accommodations - Deadline

The final day to submit a Qualified Exception to the Deadline (late consideration) for accommodations is **March 8**. A <u>Qualified Exception to the Deadline Form</u> must be completed and submitted with all requests. Online Practice Test

The online practice test for the PreACT Secure is now available and can be found on the <u>PreACT®</u> <u>Secure™ practice test webpage</u>. Login credentials are not required, please click "Practice Tests" below the sign in button. The online practice test helps students prepare for the test by replicating similar testing conditions students will experience on test day in TestNav, including online accommodations. Additional preparation information and a link to the practice test and scoring key can be found in the student <u>Preparing for PreACT Secure Guide</u>.

Test Tickets

DLM test tickets will appear in Educator Portal when the test window opens on March 18. Please remember that test tickets will only appear for students who have been rostered in each required content area and for whom First Contact Surveys (FCS) have been submitted.

Testlet Information Page (TIPs)

Please note that test tickets and TIPs only appear once the test window opens and when the student has been properly enrolled/rostered.

Spring Assessment Resources

<u>Materials Collections for ELA, Mathematics, and Science</u> are lists of materials needed to administer each subject area testlet as well as the alternative test forms for students with visual impairments. The lists also include materials that may be substituted, unless the TIP specifically states that no substitutions are allowed. Accessing the Materials Collections prior to the start of the testing window allows educators more opportunities to prepare for the administration of the assessment.

Technology System Requirements

DACs and DTCs should review the hardware and operating system requirements documentation (updated in February) for the 2023-24 administration to ensure student devices meet the minimum requirements for testing. Updated 2024 technology system requirements for student testing devices is now available on the <u>Forward Exam Technology Requirements webpage</u>.

2024 Forward Exam Required Trainings

With the test window quickly approaching, be sure staff view required training materials.

- All Test Administrators (TAs) are required to view the DPI provided Forward Exam Training for TAs video available on the <u>Forward Exam Trainings webpage</u>.
- District Technology Coordinators (DTCs) should refer to the DTC training videos, available on the <u>Forward Exam Technology Resources and Requirements webpage</u>, prior to the setup of testing devices.
- District and School Assistant Coordinators (DAC/SAC) who were unable to attend the in-person training in November, or need a refresher, should view the DAC/SAC training video available on the Forward Exam Trainings webpage.

Reading Readiness Reimbursement 2023-2024

The form asks DACs to indicate the name of each screener utilized at each grade, the number of students screened, and the amount requested for reimbursement.
