Accountability

New:

Final Joint Federal Notifications

As announced in an [email to administrators from Deputy State Superintendent Mike Thompson](#), final joint federal notifications (JFNs) were provided to schools and districts in SAFE, the Secure File Exchange on March 9. The joint notification packet includes:

- ESSA Informational Reports, which replace ESSA Accountability Reports for this year due to COVID-19; the Informational Reports contain the 2018-19 graduation rate, the 2018-19 absenteeism data, and the 2019-20 ACCESS for ELLs results.
- Progress to Exit Reports for schools with existing identifications under ESSA. Please note that updated Progress to Exit Reports will be available for identified schools in June 2021.
- IDEA LEA Determinations.
- IDEA Racial Equity in Special Education Reports, which are available for each district and include identifications and required actions, if any, for districts identified with racial disproportionality in special education identification, discipline, and/or placement.

ACCESS for ELLs

New:**Test Window Extension**

The ACCESS for ELLs test window has been extended until May 21. Post-testing dates and deadlines will be announced next week.

ACT with writing

New:

March 9 was the first day of the initial test window (Test Window 1) for the ACT with writing. Thank you to everyone for all your work administering the ACT.

May 5 Testing Opportunity

In response to the continued need for flexibility and additional testing opportunities, DPI has worked with ACT to secure one additional make-up opportunity for the ACT. An additional test day has been scheduled for **Wednesday**, May 5 and will only be administered in a paper and pencil format. An accommodations window of May 5-7 and 10-11 has also been scheduled. Additional details, including a revised Schedule of Events, will be sent to schools and districts in the coming weeks.

Returning Materials

For schools who administered the paper ACT on March 9, your materials should have been picked up by FedEx on March 10. March 16 is the last day for ACT to receive March 9 materials. If FedEx did not pick-up your materials, please contact ACT immediately at (800) 553-6244, ext. 2800. Testing materials for Test Window 1 accommodations and online testing are scheduled to be picked up on March 22. ACT will not score late arriving answer documents.

Online Testing - Post-Test Reminder

Once all testing for Test Window 1 has been completed, Technical Coordinators must purge all test content from all proctor-caching computers.

Make-Up Testing

If your school (or student) was unable to test in the first test window, it is important for you to know all of your options when determining make-up testing opportunities:

Online Testing:

- Online Testing may be utilized for all make-up testing, regardless of the initial mode of testing. Schools may use any remaining online testing dates within all three testing windows for make-ups. If you use online testing as a make-up for a missed paper date, you will need to change the test delivery format of the students to online. Please refer to the [Switching from Paper to Online Testing](#) document for instructions.
- Note: Some accommodations will still require paper testing, take note of these students and order paper accommodation make-up materials if needed.

Paper Testing Only:

- Standard Administration: March 23 or April 13 (emergency).
- Paper Accommodations: March 23-26, 29-31 or April 13-16, 19-23 (emergency).
- Reference the [Schedule of Events](#) for deadlines on when to reorder testing materials for each testing date. Note: March 12 is the last day to order make-up materials for March 23.

Aspire

New:

ACT recently announced their transition plans regarding the Aspire assessment. The statewide Aspire will still be administered in spring 2022. DPI is evaluating options for the grade 9 and 10 statewide assessment for spring 2023.

Accommodations

Test Coordinators should enter accommodations and EL supports for Aspire spring 2021 testing into the Aspire PANext portal through a student's Personal Needs Profile (PNP). Instructions are outlined in the Aspire Test Coordinator Manual.

Rater Forms

The Alternate Assessment Social Studies Rating Scale is designed to assess the educational performance of students. An individual or individuals who have first-hand knowledge of the student's IEP goals and objectives, educational curriculum, and knowledge and skills should complete this assessment tool.

Students in grades 4, 8, and 10 must be assessed in Social Studies. If you have students in these grades, verify you have created rosters for Social Studies and teachers have completed the rater forms prior to opening the Social Studies testlet. The rater forms can also be found on the [Wisconsin DLM webpage](#) under "Scoring & Reporting".

Forward Exam

New:

Read Aloud Accommodation Prior Approval

The Read Aloud accommodation is different from the Read Aloud designated support, and it is only available to a student with visual impairments who is receiving instruction in contracted braille but is not yet proficient. The student's need must be documented in an IEP or 504 plan and the student must meet all five criteria on the [Forward Exam Request for Read Aloud Accommodation Form](#).

If the student qualifies for this accommodation, the DAC must submit the request form to OEA. DPI assessment and special education staff will review the request and if approved, activate the process. Once approved, the accommodation must then be selected by the DAC in the DRC INSIGHT Portal for the student prior to printing test tickets. Students who do not have DPI prior approval for the use of the Read Aloud accommodation may have the ELA portion of their test invalidated due to the use of an inappropriate accommodation.

Students who do not meet the accommodation criteria but require Read Aloud, including students who have IEP or 504 plans, should use the Read Aloud designated support.

Test Set-up is Now Open

DACs and SACs can now edit or create test sessions, edit student data, enter accessibility features on an individual student basis, enter not-tested codes, and print test tickets in the DRC INSIGHT Portal. NAEP 2021 Monthly School Survey - February Extension

Thank you to schools and districts that helped schools complete the first round of the NAEP 2021 Monthly School Survey. As a reminder, only the schools originally selected to participate in NAEP testing (which was postponed) are participating in this survey. We have heard that some of the questions can take more time than anticipated. Our hope is that schools spend only about 30 minutes on the survey each month. If the last two questions about attendance are cumbersome, it may help to use a “typical” day from the previous month to estimate attendance rates rather than calculate a full month of attendance days. For more guidance please review the [NAEP 2021 Monthly School Survey Tip Sheet](#). Angela is reviewing error codes from submitted surveys and may contact schools this week to correct their data (for example, if a school submitted answers for their whole school instead of just grade 4 or 8). The deadline to complete the survey for February has been extended to March 12, in order to obtain more complete surveys.

Reading Readiness Reimbursement

District Assessment Coordinators will receive an email on March 12 from DPI Forms Management. This email form will allow districts to identify the amount that they are seeking to be reimbursed for Reading Readiness expenses. The form asks coordinators to indicate the name of each screener utilized at each grade, the number of students screened and the amount requested for reimbursement.
