DAC Contact Updates During the Summer and into the 2025-26 School Year

It is important to keep your District Assessment Coordinator (DAC) contact information up to date over the summer months and as staffing changes occur from 2024-25 to 2025-26. Communications from OEA will be sent to DACs over the summer and into early fall regarding assessment and accountability, **including information on data and reporting availability**. You may need to assign an Interim DAC to ensure your district continues to receive updates while filling the DAC position for the 2025-26 school year. The DAC contact information is used to verify who should have DAC level access to reports in the vendor portals. Be sure to complete a [DAC Update form](#) with the appropriate effective date noted if any changes are needed for the coming months.

Assessment Reporting and Sharing Results from the Wisconsin Student Assessment System (WSAS)

The 2024-25 Vendor-Based Reporting Information is now available under Wisconsin State Assessment Timelines on the [Assessment webpage](#). This handout provides key dates for the different phases of reporting for each statewide assessment in one document. Individual Student Reports (ISRs) should be shared with families as soon as possible. DACs should work with district and school staff to ensure assessment results are shared internally for program planning and professional development.

DPI publicly releases summary test score data for the WSAS in the fall. As such, DPI strongly recommends that districts coordinate their own public release with the DPI public release. After the secure release of results to districts and prior to the public release, DPI performs additional quality assurance, data validation, and data redaction when needed to protect student privacy.

Districts may share their summary assessment results with their school boards prior to the DPI public release. Districts may not publicly share personally identifiable information and therefore would be responsible to ensure shared results are redacted to comply with data security and student privacy requirements, as outlined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and state law. More information about maintaining student data privacy is available on the [Student Data Privacy webpage](#).

District summary data may be shared with district and school staff who understand the data security and student privacy requirements outlined in FERPA and state law. This allows district staff to use the data for professional development, continuous improvement efforts, and other planning purposes. Districts may



share individual student reports with parents or guardians, teachers, school leaders, and others with a legitimate interest.

Districts should not share the statewide data reported in the vendor portals. This data has not yet been through DPI's quality assurance and validation process and is therefore subject to change. Final statewide results, which are used in accountability calculations, will be released in WISEdash in the fall.

May Demographic Snapshot - May 13

DPI will conduct the WISEdata May Demographic Snapshot on May 13. Please take this opportunity to review your student data to ensure your enrollment and demographic values are up-to-date and accurate for the snapshot. These data will be used to make sure that demographics associated with, and reported for, assessment results are as accurate and timely as possible. Please consult with parents to ensure that they have access to score reports in a language they can understand and in a format they can access. Paper score reports will be delivered on May 8.

Student Scores and Data Reminder:

Students' scores are received 5-8 weeks post testing. Scores will be sent electronically to their MyACT accounts and a paper copy will be sent to their home address. Schools will see scores filter into [Success.ACT](#) within one week of students receiving scores in MyACT and receive a hard copy of the students' reports to retain as record. PreACT Secure Scores

Student scores are actively being uploaded to [Success.ACT](#) and will continue to post throughout May. All scores and data will be finalized on May 30. **No paper Individual Student Reports (ISRs) will be sent to schools.** Schools will be responsible for downloading and disseminating ISRs to families. DPI encourages schools to wait until all data is final before downloading and distributing ISRs. The DLM Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and summary reports will be electronically available to districts in the Educator Portal on June 23. Be sure to provide parents/guardians with ISRs as soon as possible after electronic receipt.

Assign Principal Access to Forward Exam Reports

Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and summary reports will be available electronically in the DRC INSIGHT Portal May 27. DACs should assign school principals the permission set of “School Report User” in the DRC INSIGHT Portal to access their school summary reporting dashboards and ISRs. Hard copy ISRs will be mailed to districts June 17. Be sure to send ISRs out to parents/guardians as soon as possible after receipt either in hard copy or via your secure parent portal.

Estimated Trend Data

The Forward Exam ELA and mathematics tests were extensively updated in 2023-24 to align with the revised Wisconsin academic standards in those content areas. Due to these updates, results from 2023-24 onward are reported on a new scale and with updated performance standards. The [April 25 EdLeaders Dispatch](#) shared DPI has developed summarized Forward Exam data files dating back to the 2018-19 school year that estimate how students may have performed in these years if the 2023-24 performance standards had been in place. This work provides our educators and local school leaders the ability to look at performance trends, as some had requested. These estimates are based on the revised performance levels and should be interpreted with caution. Information on the trend data and download files is
