### New:

#### 2023-24 JFN Release Timeline

Beginning in the 2023-24 school year, the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) reports will be available in February and April as part of the Joint Federal Notification (JFN) packet. #### Updated 2021-22 Progress to Exit Reports

Updated 2021-22 ESSA Progress to Exit reports for schools with 2018-19 Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) or Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) identifications are now available in [SAFE, the Secure Access File Exchange](#). The Progress to Exit reports contain new data on Exit Criterion 3 (where applicable) and show whether schools are exiting their identification(s) as of June 30.

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## PreACT Secure

PreACT Secure school and district summary reports, student level data files, and all student scores and Individualized Student Reports (ISRs) are now available in ACT's Online Reporting System (Success.ACT). #### Student ISRs

Schools should download and print Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and distribute them to students and families. 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## DLM

### New:

#### Proctor Role in Kite Educator Portal

In Educator Portal, a user role of teacher or higher is needed in order to administer the DLM assessment and to have access to score reports. In the past there was an option to select proctor as a role in Educator Portal, but this is a wrong identification, as you need to be a teacher to administer the assessment. DLM is removing the proctor role from Educator Portal to alleviate the confusion this has caused. Please check the user roles in your district and any proctor roles should be changed to teacher. If an educator is not going to administer the assessment, then please deactivate their account.

The DLM Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and summary reports are now electronically available to districts in Educator Portal. Be sure to provide parents/guardians with ISRs as soon as possible after electronic receipt.

## Forward Exam

### New:

#### Forward Exam Reports Available

Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and summary reports were made available electronically in the DRC INSIGHT Portal on June 16. Hard copy ISRs will be delivered to districts by July 14. Please share ISRs with parents/guardians as soon as possible after receipt, either in hard copy or via your secure parent portal. Districts may use the data for professional development and curriculum/instructional planning. Any staff viewing/working with Forward Exam results who have not signed a 2022-23 Forward Exam Confidentiality Form must complete the [“Report User Confidentiality Form”](#). These signed forms should be retained at the district or school. DPI will publicly release the statewide assessment results in the fall.

#### Forward Reporting Resources

[The User’s Guide to Interpreting Reports](#) is designed to help district and school staff access, understand, explain, and interpret the results of the Forward Exam. This document highlights the types of scores and various reports associated with the assessment. To use assessment information effectively, it is essential that educators understand the information in these reports. When sending ISRs home, districts should make use of the resources created to help parents/guardians understand their child’s Forward Exam results. ### Reminder:

#### Alignment with new ELA and Mathematics Standards

The spring 2024 Forward Exam for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics at grades 3-8 will be aligned to the new Wisconsin Standards for ELA (adopted in 2020) and Mathematics (adopted in 2021). Updated Forward Exam Practice Tests will be available in late fall on the [Forward Exam Practice Tests webpage](#) to help students prepare. More information about the newly aligned assessments will be communicated over the next several months.

Notification to districts with schools selected for NAEP 2024 were emailed June 7. The emails were sent to District Administrators with a copy to DACs. Angela Dugas will email school principals in schools selected for NAEP as soon as assessment dates are received from NAEP by the end of the month.

Notification for districts and schools selected for the Teaching and Learning International Survey (TALIS) will be emailed around the end of June.

## DAC Contact Updates

### Reminder:

#### Keeping Contact Information Updated During the Summer and into the 2023-24 School Year

Please keep District Assessment Coordinator (DAC) contact information up to date over the summer and as staffing changes occur in the next school year. You may need to assign an Interim DAC to ensure your district receives updates while filling the DAC position for the 2023-24 school year. DAC contact information is used to verify who should have DAC level access to reports in the vendor portals. Complete a [DAC Update form](#) if any changes are needed for the coming months.

The 2023-24 annual [District Assessment Coordinator \(DAC\) and Technology Coordinator \(DTC\) contact update forms](#) may be submitted beginning July 1. If submitting earlier than July 1 for the next school year, please make note of the effective date on the update form. These forms are **required** for both new and returning DACs and DTCs, even if the information has not changed. The information provided is used to:

- Ensure DACs receive regular assessment and accountability updates, and
- Upload information into vendor portals to ensure DACs have annual permissions.

DAC and DTC Update forms must be signed by the District Administrator/Superintendent.

Districts should also remove permissions in the test vendor portals (or make inactive) from any individuals who are no longer employed by the district and adjust user roles to sync with staffing changes.
