New Data Extract Tool

A new and improved Data Extract tool has been created by DLM to help educators determine if students are ready to test. The new Data Extract combines the Student Roster and First Contact Survey Status Extract into one page and shows if a student is rostered and if their First Contact Survey is complete. Forward Exam

Forward Exam Practice Tests:

There are several practice test options available for student use prior to the Forward Exam. These practice tests are available year round and provide students the opportunity to become familiar with the Forward Exam and its different components. All students should be given the opportunity to use the practice tests prior to actual testing. Students may perform better and with less anxiety if they are familiar with the format of the test and with the types of questions they will be required to answer. The practice tests are not scored and are not intended to determine how students will perform on the Forward Exam.
