Accountability

New:

2023-24 Report Cards Preliminary Secure Release - October 3

An update was included in the [EdLeaders Dispatch](#) sent to District Administrators on Friday, September 27 announcing that next week, October 3, DPI will release the secure preliminary versions of the 2023-24 School and District Report Cards. As in prior years, the preliminary report cards will be released via [SAFE](#), the Secure Access File Exchange. Please make sure you have [access to SAFE](#) prior to the secure release. If you have any questions about accessing SAFE, please contact the [DPI help desk](#).

As a secure report, they contain potentially identifiable student information, and have not been redacted. As such, and because the report cards are preliminary and subject to change, the secure reports and any information on the preliminary report cards may not be shared with your local media, parents, or members of the community.

The secure release opens the [report card inquiry period](#), which will take place between October 3-14. This window is an opportunity for schools and districts to work with OEA to address possible data submission errors.

Report Card Resources

In preparation for next week's secure release, we have posted [report card resources](#) to guide your review of the preliminary report cards and assist with local report card interpretation and messaging. These three resources are particularly helpful to inform initial review as part of the inquiry period:

- What's New document, outlining the updates to the report cards;
- Secure Release Checklist, which can be used when reviewing preliminary report cards; and
- Guide to Correctable Data document, outlining which accountability data may be corrected through opening an inquiry.

OEA will continue to update our resources webpage as we move towards the preliminary secure report card release, as well as the final secure and public releases planned for November.

Changes to Achievement Scoring for the 2023-24 Report Cards

As a reminder, state assessments were updated for 2023-24, including new performance level categories and updated standards. The results from these updated assessments are included in the 2023-24 report



cards. The scoring of achievement components on the 2023-24 report cards has also been modified to allow for comparability and stability in the system. In the coming year, the DPI will convene a group of education stakeholders to help align report card cut scores to accurately communicate the success of schools and districts. Target Group Preview Dashboard Updated for 2024-25

The Target Group Preview Dashboard is now available for 2024-25, showing the likelihood of students appearing in the target group of the 2024-25 report cards, based on 2024 assessment results. Please note that this dashboard is a “forward facing” tool used to inform continuous improvement efforts, so it does not reflect target group students found in the 2023-24 report cards.

The Target Group Outcomes priority area of the report cards is designed to help schools see their own “gaps” between students scoring in the lowest quartile and the rest of their student body. To support schools and districts in identifying and serving their lowest-performing students, students who are *likely* to be in the target group in future report cards at a district- and school-level are displayed securely on WISEdash for Districts.

This dashboard can be found in the ‘Early Warning’ area of WISEdash for Districts under ‘Report Card’. The data will be updated weekly from now through the December Snapshot as enrollment numbers stabilize. 2023-24 Assessment Data Public Release - October 8

An update was included in the [EdLeaders Dispatch](#) sent to District Administrators on Friday, September 27, announcing the public release of spring 2023-24 statewide assessment results for the Forward Exam, ACT, PreACT Secure, and DLM on October 8. A press release will be available on the DPI News Releases webpage and performance data from these assessments will be available in the [WISEdash public portal](#) on that day.

ACCESS Rostering

The WIDA AMS will be open for uploading non-public school Pre-ID files starting September 27. This is only required for schools not pushing enrollment data to WISEdata.

On October 10, DPI will upload the statewide roster containing all ELs reported to DPI via WISEdata. On October 24, DPI will upload a final statewide roster for ACCESS.

These roster uploads will reflect what was pushed from your SIS to WISEdata 2-3 days earlier. Once the preliminary roster is uploaded, please review it, make any necessary changes in your SIS, and create Pre-ID files for any non-public schools which weren't reporting enrollment data, but which still need to test.

At the end of the day on October 24, material orders will be generated, including labels.

Technology System Requirements

DACs and DTCs should review the hardware and operating system requirements documentation for the 2024-25 administration to ensure student devices meet the minimum requirements for testing. Middle School Mathematics Session Change

Based on feedback from the After Testing Survey, the grades 6-8 calculator session has been split into two separate sessions beginning with the 2025 administration. This means the middle school Forward Exam mathematics exam will now be three sessions in total for grades 6-8. This change should make the mathematics sessions easier for schools to schedule and students to complete within a class period. The



testing time has not changed for these grades. 2025 Testing Times are available on the [Forward Exam Resources webpage](#).

Updates for Each NAEP Assessment

Each of the NAEP assessments this year have different timelines and tasks. DACs can review emails from [Angela Dugas](#) or look at the NAEP Assessment Management System ([NAEP AMS](#)) to confirm which of their schools are in each assessment program. DACs who have not already registered for the NAEP AMS and would like to can contact [Angela Dugas](#) for a registration link.

Here's a summary of where we are in each of the NAEP assessment programs:

| NAEP Assessment | Test Window | Task Summary |
|----------------------------------|-------------------------|---|
| LTT age 13 | October 7 - December 13 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> School principals are registered on the NAEP AMS and have designated School Coordinators. Schools have completed the <i>School Characteristics</i> and submitted their student lists in the AMS. Schools should now see a list of sampled students in the AMS; they can start completing the Pre-assessment Activities. |
| LTT age 9 | January 6 - March 14 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Principals have been notified; more information will be emailed later this fall. |
| LTT age 17 | March 17 - May 23 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Principals have been notified; more information will be emailed later this fall. |
| Field Test (grades 4, 8, and 12) | January 27 - March 7 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Phase 1 is complete: Districts have submitted technology surveys for their schools. In October, districts and schools will be notified which of the schools from phase 1 will be selected for phase 2 (the assessment). |

Fall Student Rostering

Fall API student rostering for aimswebPlus has now been completed through WISEdata. Districts should check to ensure all students are now rostered and follow the guidance on the “Rostering/Data Management” section of the [aimswebPlus Wisconsin website](#) if additional student rostering is needed.

Fall and Mid-Year Testing Windows

The fall and mid-year testing windows have been adjusted slightly to ensure compliance with the Wisconsin statute. These adjustments also provide districts with earlier reporting, resulting in more time to implement early literacy instruction and intervention. The testing windows are as follows:

- Fall - August 1 – October 17, 2024
- Mid-year - December 1 – January 31, 2025
- Spring - March 16 – July 31, 2025
