What is the EBB Program?

The Emergency Broadband Benefit Program is a Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program that provides a temporary discount on monthly broadband bills for qualifying low-income households.



Temporary Discount

- Eligible households can receive:
 - Up to a \$50/month discount on your broadband service and associated equipment rentals
 - Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands
 - A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)



Which Services Qualify?

- Internet bundled with voice is allowed
- Internet bundled with video (TV) is not allowed
- Dial-up service is allowable in cases where it is the only service available.
- Device benefit may be used for a laptop, desktop or tablet. (not a mobile phone)
- Limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per eligible household



Who Qualifies

- Qualifies for the FCC's Lifeline program, including those who are on Medicaid or receive SNAP benefits
- Is approved for the free or reduced price school breakfast/lunch program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision,
- Experienced substantial documented loss of income since February 29, 2020 with a total household income in 2020 below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers
- Received a federal Pell grant in the current award year
- Qualifies for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 relief program



School Verification for NSLP

- Documentation verifying student participation in the NSLP and SBP in either program during the 2019–2020 or 2020–2021 school year.
- Template for School Verification Letter provided at <https://tech.ed.gov/broadband/ebb/>.
- (USAC) will automatically check the name of the CEP school or district against the Food Research and Action Center ([FRAC](#)) [database](#).



Application Process

Option 1: Apply with a Service Provider

- The consumer contacts a service provider
 - The service provider helps the consumer apply in person using the National Verifier service provider portal
- OR
- The service providers helps the consumer apply using their FCC approved alternative verification process

Option 2: Apply Online

- The consumer visits the National Verifier from any computer or mobile device to complete the electronic application
- The consumer contacts a service provider to enroll in the EBB Program

Option 3: Apply by Mail

- The consumer fills out and signs the National Verifier EBB Application Form
- The consumer mails the application and supporting documentation to the Emergency Broadband Support Center
- Service providers may assist consumers with the paper application and mail it on the consumer's behalf

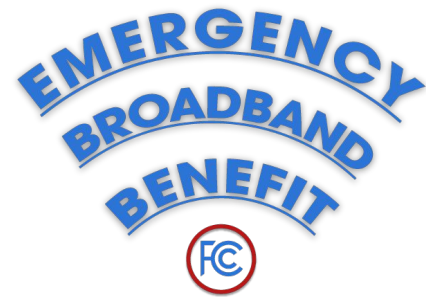

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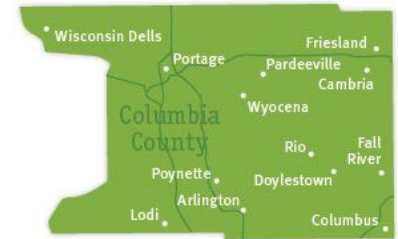
Portage Library & School District Outreach

- Benefits of Teaming Up
 - Public Library: space, time, technology, outreach channels, community connections
 - School: connections to families in need, knowledge of program, outreach channels, F/R lunch documentation
- Furthering the Mission
 - Public Library Mission - Connecting the community to resources, services, and technologies to match their interests and needs
 - School District - Success of every student in hybrid/virtual/physical environment, connected academically and socially



Portage Library & School District Outreach

- Benefiting the Community (Pre-COVID data)
 - 20.3% of Columbia County without internet subscription
 - 12.64% Poverty Rate
 - 2.7% Unemployment (Rose to 4% in 2020)
- Need for connections to social services and aid
 - Public Library Initiative: **Community Workforce & Service Connection**
 - Schools: High needs due to virtual/hybrid, parent training/support, hotspots highly sought after.

Portage Library & School District Outreach

- We Learned:
 - The number of options they had to verify their information, qualify, and the number of times they had to verify their information was confusing
 - Make sure to have folks apply for the EBB and **NOT** the lifeline program, unless they were intending to apply for both.
- We're Looking Forward To:
 - Since the application takes 10-15 minutes normally - getting more folks signed up right away!
 - Assisting Endeavor's patrons at their library!
 - Building the libraries and schools as community resource for all!
