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SFSP Application - Open for Updates March 3rd!

Sponsors may begin updating their SFSP application starting March 3rd. It is due April 10th if ordering USDA Foods and/or requesting an advance in payment. All others are due May 5th. In addition to the Webinar mentioned below, here are several important resources to help you through the Process:

ALL SPONSORS are required to register for one of the training options to participate in the SESP

Option 1: Pop-up Sessions (Oak Creek, Sparta, Stevens Point, Appleton): These sessions will be an open time period (no formal presentation) where returning sponsors can 'pop-in' to receive program updates, the latest resources from DPI and USDA, and receive one-on-one training with the DPI SFSP consultants. We'll be there to help you plan your 2023 program, assist with identifying community partners and potential sites for expansion, and answer specific questions you may have. Each location will provide the same information; choose the one most convenient to you!

- Oak Creek Wednesday, March 15, 2023, 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.
- Sparta Thursday, March 23, 2023, 1:30 p.m. 4:00 p.m.
- Stevens Point Thursday, March 30, 2023, 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.
- Appleton Wednesday, March 29, 2023, 1:00 p.m. 4:00 p.m.

Option 2: Full Day Training (Rice Lake, Madison): These full day group trainings will provide a comprehensive review of the SFSP administrative and operational requirements. Topics covered will include site eligibility, meal service requirements, production planning, procurement, site training and monitoring, civil rights requirements, meal counting, claiming, and financial management. This training is for new sponsors, returning sponsors with new administrative staff and any other sponsor personnel that that would like a complete refresher.

- Madison Wednesday, April 5, 2023, 9:00 a.m. 3:30 p.m.

Option 3: E-Learning Course: If not attending a Pop-up or a Full Day Training, you are required to Register for the E-Learning Course. This is available online and can be accessed 24/7 without a password. The 15 Lessons must be reviewed prior to starting SFSP operation. Complete the form at the end of each lesson for verification that the Lesson has been completed.

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's Community Nutrition Team has a Limited Term Employment (LTE) Nutrition Program Consultant summer job opportunity working with the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). This position would work approximately ~500/hours during the months of mid-May through August

2023. Pay rate is \$25.32/ hour. This position includes traveling throughout Wisconsin conducting reviews of the SFSP at organizations (ex. Schools, college-prep programs, community centers, YMCAs, parks, etc.).
