Non-congregate Meal Waivers Available for Excessive Heat Days

DPI has received approval from USDA to allow SFSP and SSO sponsors, in good standing, to request to waive the congregate meal service requirement, at approved outdoor meal sites that are not temperature-controlled, on days when the area is experiencing excessive heat. Non-congregate meal service may be offered only on days when the National Weather Service (NWS) has issued a Heat Advisory, an Excessive Heat Warning, or an Excessive Heat Watch for the area in which an approved outdoor meal site is located. Please note that this waiver is not the same as the new option to provide a rural non-congregate meal service as described in Section 13(a)(13) of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42U.S.C. 1761). This waiver is not limited to sites in rural areas and may only be applied to sites approved for congregate meal service.

Sponsors must be approved to provide non-congregate meals prior to the excessive heat day. If interested in applying for this waiver, please send an email to sfsp@dpi.wi.gov.

Statewide SFSP Media Release

On May 26th, DPI issued a <u>Statewide Media Release</u> on behalf of all sponsors. This media release fulfills the requirement to notify the public of all SFSP sponsors and sites operating in Wisconsin and provides the non-discrimination statement and complaint procedure. Sponsors are no longer required to submit their own media release; however, sponsors of camps and enrolled sites must notify participants of the availability of

free meals. Other sponsors should continue to make the community aware of open sites. Remember to register your open sites with Wisconsin 2-1-1 and promote the Summer Meals Site Finder. A list of sponsors and sites that will be updated throughout the summer, can also be found on the SFSP webpage.

Child Care and Summer Meals

Children that are enrolled in a childcare center that operates the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), may only receive meals through the SFSP, when not in the care of the childcare center. For instance, if a child enrolled in the childcare center is also enrolled in summer school, that child can receive meals though the SFSP while attending summer school. When back in the care of the childcare center, the child may receive meals through the CACFP.

Expand Your Reach this Summer!

As initial SFSP application approvals are coming to an end with the start of summer, we wanted to remind sponsors that you may continue to expand your Programs throughout the summer by:

- Extending dates of operation -consider continuing to offer meals after summer school ends.
- Adding additional sites consider partnering with community groups like the park and recreation department or your local library to offer meals to kids during their planned activities.
- Contact your local food bank or pantry to ask about opportunities to partner in the community.
- Adding an additional meal service, if you're currently only offering one meal (most sponsors can offer up to 2 meal services per day in any combination other than lunch and supper.)
- Adding a rural non-congregate program, if eligible.

All of these require approval from DPI prior to service. Please reach out to your assigned consultant for more information.
