THE STUDENT TRAINEE WILL:

- 1. Report promptly and engage in their assignment according to the schedule.
- 2. Cooperate with the supervisor, engage in the assignment as a training experience, observe etiquette, and observe safety rules.
- 3. Notify school and training site in advance when absence is unavoidable.
- 4. Maintain satisfactory grades in all subjects in order to remain eligible for the program.

- 10. Not report to work when absent from school unless approved by teacher coordinator.

THE TRAINING STATION WILL:

- 1. Provide training for the student.
- 2. Provide supervision for the training of the student.
- 3. Provide for the day to day safety of the student on the job.
- 4. Adhere to all child labor laws.
- 5. Comply with the provisions of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 by not discriminating on the basis of sex, handicap, race, color, or national origin in its treatment and assignment of students to jobs, hours of employment, levels of responsibility and pay.

THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN WILL:

- 1. Be responsible for the conduct of the student while participating in the program.

The student trainee agrees to perform to the best of their ability all duties assigned and conform to all rules and policies of their place of employment and the school. Student trainees expect no special privileges, agree to be on the job every scheduled day (barring illness), and will confer with their coordinating teacher regarding any problems encountered on the job.

The parent or guardian agrees to cooperate with the school and employer to insure the best possible results from the student's training.
