

**Subject:** Emergency Assistance for Non-Public Schools Program Update #7

Greetings Wisconsin Private Schools and Interested Parties,

The EANS application review process is now complete. This email provides a summary of that process, and some next steps and timelines.

### **All EANS Applications have been reviewed.**

As of Wednesday, May 5th, all schools with completed EANS applications should have received an email from [EANS@dpi.wi.gov](mailto:EANS@dpi.wi.gov) with their program status. We received applications for 466 schools and 450 schools were accepted into the program. The majority of schools not accepted were not eligible because they received a PPP loan on or after December 27, 2020.

**Updated EANS allocations to the 450 accepted schools should be finalized by the end of May, 2021.**

We will continue to update the DPI page as needed, but also encourage EANS Program schools to **bookmark the [CESA 6 EANS webpage](#)**, as this will be an important starting point for all reimbursements and to access direct services from your CESA.

As we transition into program administration, this is the last time these EANS Program Update emails will be sent to the full private school distribution list. Future EANS updates will be sent to contacts for schools in the EANS Program, but all updates will continue to be posted to the [DPI EANS webpage](#).
