Step 1: Verify that you are reporting the correct courses for ECCP reimbursement

- ✓ **Only report courses that take place at the college or university**
 - Taught by an instructor from the college or university
 - Can include online or blended courses
 - Courses that take place at the high school/district are not eligible for reimbursement
- ✓ **Only report courses from a UW, Private, or Tribal College in WI**
 - Wisconsin Technical College courses are not eligible
 - Colleges or universities outside of Wisconsin are not eligible
- ✓ **Ensure there is an approved [ECCP application](#) for each course you report for reimbursement**

Step 1 (continued)

✓ **Make sure the student passed and completed each course you report for reimbursement**

- If a student does not complete or pass the course, the school district may invoice the family for the tuition payment.

✓ **Make sure the college or university is invoicing your school at the reduced tuition rate**

UW Campuses: one-third of the amount that would be charged for each credit assigned to the course to an individual who is a resident of this state and who is enrolled in the educational institution as an undergraduate student.

UW Two Year Colleges and Tribal Colleges: one-half of the amount that would be charged for each credit assigned to the course to an individual who is a resident of this state and who is enrolled in the college campus as an undergraduate student.

WI Private Colleges/Universities: one-third of the amount that would be charged for each credit assigned to a similar course offered by the University of Wisconsin-Madison to an individual who is a resident of this state and who is enrolled at the University of Wisconsin-Madison as an undergraduate student.

Step 2: Organize your ECCP courses by institution, semester and credit

Institution = Name of the college or university that granted credit

Semester = Summer, Fall, or Spring (assign trimester, or interim sessions to the label that fits best)

Credit = High School and College Credit or College Credit Only

- If the district does not offer a comparable course and the ECCP course fulfills a graduation requirement for the student the course must provide high school and college credit
- If the district does not offer a comparable course and the ECCP course does NOT fulfill a graduation requirement for the student the course is listed as college credit only
- If you're not sure, check with the person who approved the ECCP Application/Participation form (often a school counselor)

Step 3: Access your district's online ECCP reimbursement form

Your school administrator received an email with the unique link to access your district's (or private school's) ECCP reimbursement form. If you are entering in the courses on behalf of your district/private school you will need to get this link from your administrator.

Step 4: Enter your ECCP courses into your ECCP reimbursement form

Only ONE person from your district or private school should submit this form. Information you enter will automatically save. You may exit and return using your unique link as needed. Enter in the total tuition your public school district or private school paid to each Institution of Higher Education (IHE). You will need to enter this information for each semester. And, you will enter a separate line for each credit type: College Only or High School/College. Instructions: 1) Click "Add Row" to get started. 2) Select the semester for which you wish to enter information using the drop-down menu. The semester should correspond to the semester or session listed on the student's participation form. 3) Select the credit type using the drop-down menu. 4) Select the College/University name using the drop-down menu. 5) Enter the number of students to which this line applies. 6) Enter the total number of credits earned by the total students in the previous field. 7) Enter in the TOTAL dollar amount your district or private school paid for tuition for this line. 8) Click the Update button to save the row - the Reimbursement Rate and Maximum Reimbursement will automatically populate. 9) Click "Add Row" to enter additional lines as needed

Step 5: Submit your form

Once you have added all your eligible ECCP courses for the year, submit your form. Should you need to go back and make changes you can do so using your link any time during the submission period: May 30-July15
