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Free and reduced-price meal eligibility increases for eighth year

MADISON — For the eighth consecutive year, student eligibility for free or reduced-price school meals increased in Wisconsin; for the current school year, 42.5 percent of students qualify based on family income.

Wisconsin has 353,339 public school students who were identified as eligible for free or reduced-price school meals during the October count required under federal law. This represents an increase of 7,155 students over last school year, a 2.1 percent increase in the number of students eligible for free or reduced-price meals. More than 100 districts in the state have 50 percent or more of their students eligible for free or reduced-price meals, including four of the state’s five largest districts: Milwaukee Public Schools, Racine, Green Bay Area, and Madison Metropolitan. Last school year, 41.4 percent of students were eligible for free or reduced-price school meals.

“There is no question that families in Wisconsin are hurting economically,” said State Superintendent Tony Evers. “Information from the 2010 census confirms what school meal data tells us about the increase in poverty among Wisconsin’s school-age population. This is no time to crush the hope that schools provide by preparing children to become citizens, workers, scientists, and entrepreneurs. The 2011-13 state budget for education funding was absolutely the wrong place to cut because these cuts diminish opportunities for our kids and jeopardize their future and ours.”

According to federal eligibility guidelines for the National School Lunch and School Breakfast programs, school meals are free to children who live in households with annual incomes at or below 130 percent of the federal poverty rate, or \$29,055 for a family of four. Students approved for reduced-price meals, which account for 6.2 percent of public school students statewide this school year, have an annual household income that is under 185 percent of the federal poverty rate. For a family of four, income would be between \$29,055 and \$41,348.

Evers noted that state policymakers can provide some relief to school districts to support the education of all children by reforming the way Wisconsin funds its schools. “My ‘Fair Funding for Our Future’ proposal deals

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with inequities in Wisconsin's funding system by accounting for household income in the distribution of school equalization aid. By means of an example, the Webster School District has more than 77 percent of its students who are eligible for subsidized school meals based on household income. Yet, because of the high property values in the district, Webster does not receive any state equalization aid to support the education of its children. My 'Fair Funding' proposal can change that, even in this economy, without raising net property taxes statewide."

Families can apply for free or reduced-price school meals at any time, though schools enroll most students for the school lunch and school breakfast programs at the beginning of the school year. Eligibility is based on total household income. Families that receive FoodShare, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or Wisconsin Works (W-2) benefits and foster children who have been formally placed by a state welfare agency or court are eligible for free meals. All information about eligibility is kept confidential and programs must follow nondiscrimination laws.

"Poverty and hunger are cruel facts of our difficult economy and can have a harsh impact on student learning," Evers said. "I am grateful for the National School Lunch and School Breakfast programs; they have been providing nutritious meals to school-age children for decades. This commitment to a social safety net can make a tremendous difference in the life of a child. Research shows that students who eat school meals perform better in math, reading, and other subjects; are more attentive in class; and have better behavior in school."
