# **Permanency Plan Review Input Tool**

DPI, in collaboration with DCF, and after extensive stakeholder feedback, has developed an optional resource for LEAs to provide meaningful input to courts and review panels conducting permanency plan reviews or hearings.

Schools must receive notice whenever there is a review of, or hearing on, a child's permanency plan, and they have the opportunity to provide input at the hearing or review. Schools can offer a unique perspective to the Permanency Plan, as they can be a source of continuity during what may be a disruptive time in a child's life. We encourage schools to add thoughtful and evidence-based input in the process. This input serves as another opportunity for a child's voice and advocacy to be heard.

The tool is available in two formats: a PDF that is easy to print (and fillable by hand), and the Word format that can be completed electronically before printing.

# **Instructional Model Considerations**

Educational stability during COVID-19 has changed how schools and child welfare agencies think about meeting a student's greatest needs.

The <u>Ohio Dept. of Education</u> has some questions and suggestions to consider if school instructional models change. Some of these scenarios and tools are specific to Ohio, but the questions below and some recommendations for best practices can be useful in Wisconsin as well.

- How can local school district foster care points of contact provide additional support to students in foster care during an instructional model change?
- Where can best practices for engaging with families and caregivers of youth in foster care be found?
- How can schools support students in foster care who are seniors in high school or older youth?
- How can school districts and child welfare agencies collaborate for "best interest determination" meetings?
- How can foster families and caseworkers ensure students in foster care who have IEPs or Section 504 plans are receiving educational services during the 2020-21 school year?
