The Role of the Liaison

Liaisons Are Required to Ensure That:

- Children and youth experiencing homelessness are identified
- Children and youth experiencing homelessness are immediately enrolled and fully participating in school
- Young children experiencing homelessness are identified and have access to early childhood programs
- Children and youth experiencing homelessness receive referrals to community organizations for needs such as medical, dental, and mental health

Liaisons Are Required to Ensure That:

- Students have access to full participation in school
- Awareness and outreach activities are conducted in both the school and community
- Policies and procedures are reviewed and revised to remove barriers to identification, enrollment, and retention
- Students have access to transportation to and from the school of origin

Liaisons Are Required to Ensure That:

- All school staff are trained at least annually
- Unaccompanied youth are identified and services are provided


