

Wisconsin Future Ready Report summary, 2015-2016


The Future Ready Framework is designed to help school districts create an **action plan** to move as quickly as possible towards preparing students for success in college, career, and citizenship. This action plan can only be accomplished through a systemic approach to change, as outlined in the Future Ready Framework. With **personalized student learning at the center**, a district must align each of the seven (7) key categories, called "Gears", in order to ensure a successful digital conversion.

The 7 Gears are as follows:

- *Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment*
- *Use of Space and Time*
- *Robust Infrastructure*
- *Data and Privacy*
- *Community Partnerships*
- *Personalized Professional Learning*
- *Budget and Resources*

In Wisconsin in 2015-2016, 20 school district leaders and stakeholders took Future Ready self-assessments to guide them in creating a Future Ready Action Plan for their districts. The assessments yielded a score for each of the seven Gears. Compiled results are below.
