## *Notice of Intent To Review Academic Standards*

On February 8, 2017, the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction will start a review of academic standards in Information and Technology Literacy. To ensure that Wisconsin Academic Standards prepare all students to be college and career ready, these standards represent the common skills, knowledge, and dispositions that are necessary for students to succeed. Wisconsin Academic Standards are reviewed, revised, or both on an ongoing basis, and their adoption and use by schools is voluntary in state statute.
