



What is a State Natural Area?

The DNR's system of nearly 700 State Natural Areas protects rare species and spaces that define our state.

State Natural Areas include acres of wildflower-studded prairies, towering old-growth forests, boggy wetlands and Great Lakes dunes. When you visit a State Natural Area located within a State Park Property, you gain access to additional landscapes and places to explore and nearby amenities, like parking and restrooms, otherwise not normally available.

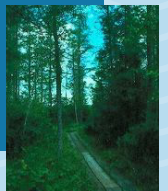

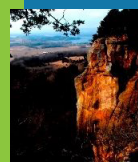
