

2019 Educator Preparation Programs Annual Report

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Background/Context

Wisconsin Act 166 (passed in 2011) requires the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to produce an annual report on the State's educator preparation programs (EPPs). This report must include information on the number of program completers by licensure type at each EPP, along with first-time pass rates on required licensure assessments. Additional data, such as how many EPP completers receive licensure and find work in Wisconsin public schools, are included as additional descriptive measures of Wisconsin's educator workforce.

Definitions

EPP Program Completers are unduplicated counts of candidates who have completed an approved educator preparation program and all requirements for licensure between September 1, 2017, and August 31, 2018, making them eligible for licensure in Wisconsin.

Licensed in Wisconsin refers to 2017-18 EPP Program Completers who received one or more Wisconsin teaching licenses between December 1, 2017, and August 31, 2018, after successfully completing an educator preparation program.

- **Note:** Some program completers do not seek Wisconsin licensure because they move to another state, seek employment in a private school, or work in a non-education field.

Employed in Wisconsin refers to EPP Program Completers from 2017-18 who were employed in Wisconsin public schools during the 2018-19 school year. These data will not include EPP completers employed in another state or in a Wisconsin private school.

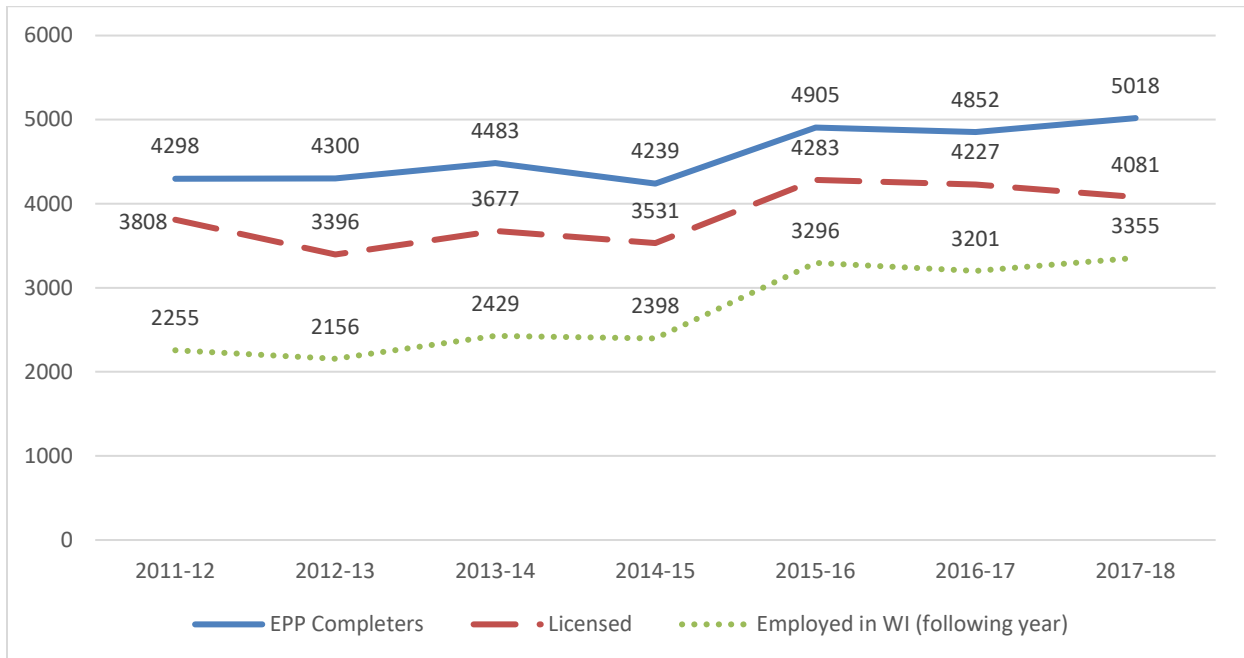
Data Highlights

Between September 1, 2017, and August 31, 2018 (referred to hereafter as the 2017-18 program year), 5018 individual (unduplicated) candidates completed their studies in one of Wisconsin's 42 approved educator preparation program (Figure 1 and Table 1). This represents a 16.8% increase in EPP completers from 2011-12 (and a 3.4% increase from 2016-17), and is above the seven-year average of 4585 completers. Over the same period of time (2011-12 to 2017-18), total enrollment in Wisconsin's EPPs decreased by 23%, or more than 2500 unique individuals.

A large majority of 2017-18 EPP completers (81.3%) applied for and received a Wisconsin educator license, although conversely this means that 937 educators - almost one-fifth of the pipeline - was immediately lost from the Wisconsin public school labor supply. The share of 2017-18 EPP completers receiving licensure (81.3%) was below the seven-year average rate of 84.1%, and represented a 8.2% decrease from 2011-12. Approximately two-thirds (66.9%) of 2017-18 EPP completers were employed in a Wisconsin public school during the following (2018-19) school year. This "yield rate" of 66.9% for 2017-18 EPP completers (3355 educators working in Wisconsin public schools in 2018-19 divided by 5018 EPP completers from 2017-18)

is very similar to yield rates from the prior two years (66.0% for 2016-17 EPP completers and 67.2% for 2015-16 EPP completers), but is higher than the seven-year average yield rate of 59.1%. In other words, between one-half and one-third of the potential supply of new educators in Wisconsin has been lost almost immediately in recent years.¹ Yield rates among Wisconsin’s public and private EPPs for 2017-18 completers are similar (Table 2), while the yield rate for the state’s alternate route (non-traditional) EPPs is higher at 83.5% (although alternate route completers are far fewer numerically).

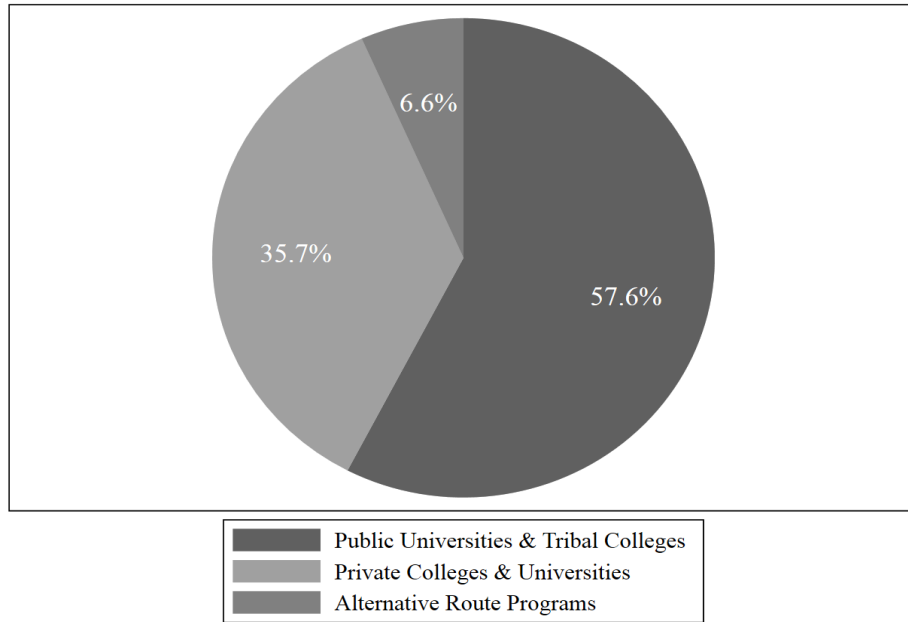

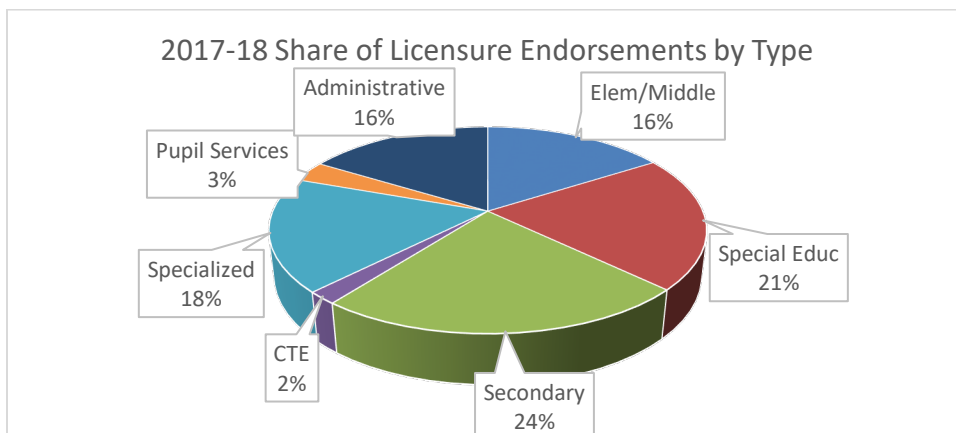
In terms of overall “market share,” Wisconsin’s public and tribal EPPs produce nearly 60% of all completers statewide (Figure 2), similar to previous years. Alternative route programs have increased their market share, from approximately 4% to 7% of the state total over the past seven years.

Turning next to counts of licensure endorsements, which differ from counts of EPP completers because individual completers can receive multiple licensure endorsements, the largest share of licensure endorsements by type in 2017-18 across all Wisconsin EPPs combined (Figure 3) is at the secondary level (24% of all endorsements), followed by Special Education (21%). The 2017-18 data are very similar to previous years, although one slowly-emerging trend is that Elementary/Middle endorsements have decreased percentage-wise, from approximately 20% of all endorsements among 2015-16 EPP completers statewide to 16% among 2017-18 completers.

Wisconsin’s three main types of EPPs (public and tribal, private, and alternative route) differ somewhat with respect to which licensure endorsement types (Elementary/Middle, Special Education, Secondary, etc.) represent the largest share of the endorsements they make (see Table 3). A higher share of the endorsements granted by the state’s public and tribal EPPs, for example, are for Special Education (23.8% of all endorsements in 2017-18), Secondary (23.3%), and Elementary/Middle (18.7%), with only 7.6% of the public/tribal total consisting of Administrative endorsements. The state’s private EPPs, in contrast, focus more on Administrative endorsements (which are 32.3% of all endorsements by private EPPs in 2017-18) and Secondary (25.1%), and less on Elementary/Middle (only 2.3% of the total for private EPPs). Alternative route EPPs produce proportionately more endorsements in Special Education (31.3%) and Administrative (25.0%), with far fewer at the Elementary levels (2.4%). Public EPPs produce the largest share of the state total for each type of licensure endorsement except for Administrative licenses, of which the state’s private EPPs are the largest producers.

Note: Program Completers can be endorsed for multiple licenses. Consequently, Wisconsin produced 5,442 more endorsements for licensure (10,460) than program completers (5018) in 2017-18.

Changes over time in numbers of licensure endorsements, as well as endorsements by license type, are shown in Table 4 below. Wisconsin EPPs produced more than double the number of endorsements in 2017-18 (10,460) compared to 2011-12 (4836). The fact that endorsements increased more than numbers of EPP completers (from Table 1) indicates that more completers are graduating with dual licensure. Looking at licensure data by license type, Table 4 shows that Wisconsin EPPs produced 28 fewer Elementary/Middle endorsements in 2017-18 compared to 2011-12 (a 1.6% decrease), while all other license types *increased*, including increases of 1603 for Special Education licensures (+268.1%), 1670 for Secondary licensures (+211.7%), and 1259 Specialized licensures (+205.4%). Table 5 shows “market share” data for licensure endorsements by EPP type (in contrast to market share for program completers, from Figure 2).

Licensure Assessments

Per 2011 Wisconsin Act 166, this report includes information on candidates' first-time and overall pass rates on required licensure tests. Testing data summarized below include candidates who were enrolled in educator preparation programs and took tests between September 1, 2017, and August 31, 2018. Students are not considered program completers or endorsed for licensure until they have passed all required assessments for their area of licensure. Accordingly, there are more test-takers than program completers for most educator preparation programs.

Wisconsin Administrative Code section PI 34 has always required candidates to demonstrate their content knowledge, initially through standardized testing only. However, PI 34 was amended in July 2017 to allow teacher and pupil services candidates to demonstrate content knowledge with a 3.0 or higher GPA in their license area or by successfully completing a content-based portfolio in addition to passing a content test. This change means that there were fewer candidates taking Praxis II and ACTFL tests.

Note that EPPs that are based at institutions of higher education are also required to report candidate test scores to the federal government under Title II of the Higher Education Opportunities Act (for more information, see <https://title2.ed.gov/Public/Home.aspx>). Title II data is centered around completers and the academic year in which they complete their program, which is different than this report. Data below are based on the academic year in which the candidate took the assessment. Moreover, the data include all candidates rather than just those who completed an approved program. Therefore, pass rates in this report may differ from the Title II reported pass rates.

Praxis II

The Praxis II, administered by the Education Testing Service (ETS), assess candidates' content knowledge in all subjects (except for World Languages—see below). A complete listing of Praxis II subject area tests used in Wisconsin is available at <http://www.ets.org/Praxis/wi/requirements>. Applicants for regular and special education licensure complete the Elementary Education or Middle School Content assessment, while those seeking licensure in subject areas at the middle and high school level take the Praxis II assessment for their subject area.

Tables 8a-8e provide information on Praxis II pass rates for 2017-18 EPP completers, both overall (statewide) and for individual EPPs, broken out where appropriate by content area and by gender and race/ethnicity of test-takers. Data are suppressed when the number of test-

takers is small (fewer than 10) in order to protect confidentiality. The first three columns of data in the tables below refer to candidates who took the required test for the first time between September 1, 2017, and August 31, 2018. The final column includes candidates who first took the test prior to September 1, 2017, *and also took it* between September 2017 and August 2018. Therefore, the pass rate for “Any Attempt” may be higher or lower than the first-time pass rate.

ACTFL Language Assessments

ACTFL language assessments are required for all World Language teacher candidates enrolled in Wisconsin EPPs beginning September 2011 (<http://www.languagetesting.com>). Shown below are ACTFL results for 2017-18 EPP completers statewide (Table 9a) and by EPP (Table 9b), with most of the results for individual EPPs suppressed due to small numbers of test-takers.

Wisconsin Foundations of Reading Test

The Wisconsin Foundations of Reading Test (FORT) assesses proficiency and depth of understanding of the science of reading and writing instruction among prospective teachers. Applicants for initial licensure as an elementary teacher (grades K-5), special education teacher, reading teacher, or reading specialist – or any candidate seeking dual licensure in one of these subject areas plus a different one - must receive a passing score on FORT (see <http://www.wi.nesinc.com/Home.aspx>). Figure 4 shows FORT passing rates for the past four cohorts of EPP completers statewide, including both first attempt and any attempt (since some re-take FORT multiple times). Pass rates have remained relatively stable, at approximately two-thirds of first-time test takers and 70-75% of any attempt. Tables 10a-10e show FORT passing rates across all Wisconsin EPPs statewide for 2017-18 completers broken out by gender and race/ethnicity as well as by EPP (with data suppressed for fewer than 10 test-takers).

Figure 4: FORT Passing Rates for all EPPs Statewide

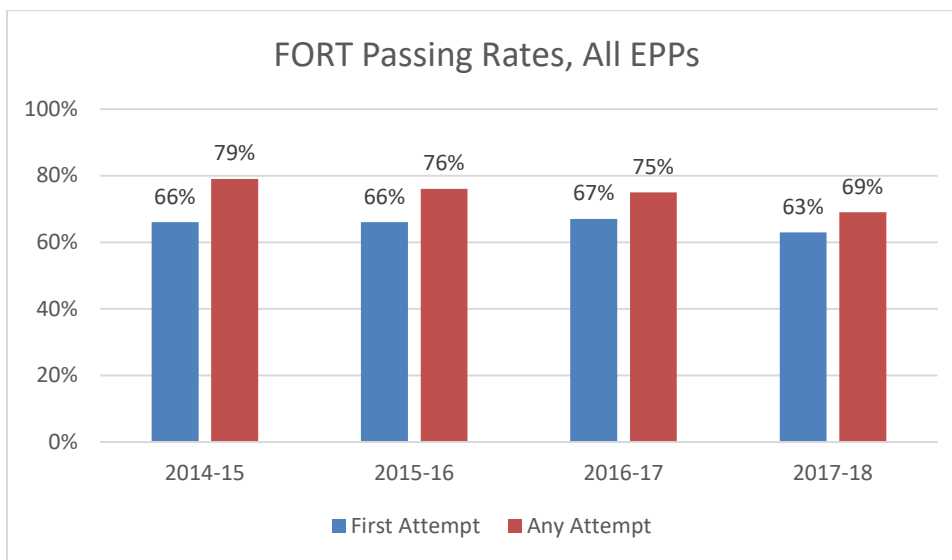

Educative Teacher Performance Assessment (edTPA)

The edTPA (<https://dpi.wi.gov/licensing/epp/edtpa>) is a preservice teacher performance assessment fully implemented in Wisconsin beginning with the 2016-17 school year. Candidates for licensure submit a portfolio of materials (including lesson plans and samples of student work) prior to or during student teaching for review and scoring by a panel of certified reviewers. The vast majority of subjects require a 15-rubric edTPA portfolio, but some use a 13-rubric portfolio.

The process used to review the edTPA does not lend itself to providing a first-time pass rate because candidates are allowed a one-time resubmission of rubrics of their choosing. The vendor does not disaggregate data regarding resubmissions.

Tables 11a and 11b show edTPA passing rates statewide and by individual EPP, respectively. Nearly all EPP completers statewide in 2017-18 (96%) received passing edTPA scores on the 15-rubric portfolio, which was the same passing rate among 2016-17 completers (the only other year of data since edTPA became required).
