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Wisconsin Recognition Programs

- Wisconsin Teachers of the Year
- Herb Kohl Teacher Fellowship Program
- Presidential Awards for Excellence in Math and Science Teaching
- Wisconsin Master Educator Assessment Process and Grants





Wisconsin Teachers of the Year

- 5 teachers selected annually, representing elementary, middle, and high schools and special services from Kohl Fellows
- DPI convenes selection committee that interviews candidates
- Serve as representatives of teaching and public education
- One teacher of the year selected to represent WI in national Teacher of the Year Program

Herb Kohl Teacher Fellowship

- 100 PK-12 teachers (public and private) annually
- Nominated by community; no self-nomination
- \$6,000 personal grant and matching grant to school
- Pool of public school Kohl fellows become candidate pool for WI Teacher of the Year program

Presidential Awards for Excellence in Math and Science Teaching

- Science, Math public and private teachers in K-12 (alternating K-6 or 7-12 annually)
- Nominated by the public or self
- Signed presidential award and \$10,000 award from the National Science Foundation
- National Math and Science Teachers of the Year

Wisconsin Master Educator Assessment Process and Grants

- Complete a rigorous assessment process (National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or WMEAP) and (qualify to) hold a lifetime license in their area.
- Qualify for reimbursement grant of \$2,000
- Eligible for annual \$2,500 (\$5,000 if in high-poverty school) grant if maintaining Master Licensure and Wisconsin school employment

NCCAT Empower Beginning Teacher of the Year

- Partnership program among North Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching, the state education agencies, and other partners
- Highlight excellent practice among new and early career teachers
- \$5,000 cash prize (\$2,000 runner-up), "GoGlobal NC" trip, and instructional supplies for awardee's school
- Finalists participate with NCCAT to promote teaching excellence

- Acknowledges educators "utilizing new and innovative ways to incorporate digital learning into their work."

Kansas Exemplary Educator Pool

- Identifies outstanding performing educators in mid-career (must > 5 years and < 18 years of experience)
- Seeks to identify "unheralded, yet worthy of the spotlight" educators.
- Potentially identifies these educators for future more prestigious state or national recognition.
