



How to Check for License Stipulations


What are License Stipulations?

When reviewing applicants for Wisconsin licensure based on programs from another state, DPI reviews application materials against applicable statutory stipulations. Statutory stipulations are requirements set forth under the law (s.118 and PI 34). They mandate teachers must be trained and demonstrate proficiency in certain topics. An educator who has not met all applicable statutory stipulations may in some cases be issued a Tier II provisional license with these cited stipulations. The applicant must complete all statutory stipulations within a specified amount of time.

Check Your License for Stipulations:

1. Log in to DPI Educator Licensing Online (ELO) portal


If you have previously logged in to ELO, the system will recognize you when you enter the required information. If this is your first time, ELO will assign you a unique "entity number." DPI uses your entity number to maintain your records.



2. Onboard

All ELO interactions start and end at the Quick Start Menu. The first time you use ELO you must onboard. Click "Onboard Now!" as shown below. Enter the required information as prompted on subsequent screens. ELO will return you to the Quick Start menu after you have onboarded.

Note: Interactions with ELO are referred to as "transactions."



3. Check for Stipulations

Click the "Show Stipulations" button. Stipulations, if they exist, will be listed in a pop-up window.
