WHEREAS: ensuring cybersecurity safeguards students' personally identifiable

information is vital to their success utilizing online resources to achieve

educational excellence on their path to being future ready; and

WHEREAS: October 1-31 is proclaimed Keeping Kids Safe Online month in Wisconsin

to support and commit to the well-being and security of ALL our youth in

this digital age as we empower the children of Wisconsin to be responsible digital citizens and to navigate the online world with
