Career pathways are a series of connected educational experiences and support strategies aimed at helping students achieve their own definition of success.


What do Career Pathways Mean for our Kids?

The Project Goals


Dramatically increase the number of students who successfully complete career pathways that begin in secondary school and culminate in postsecondary degrees or credentials tied to high-wage, high-demand jobs.

Catalyze transformational approaches to the design and delivery of programs and policies to increase students' career readiness and disseminate lessons learned around the world.



Pathways Wisconsin will:

- *Build* regional career pathways for the jobs and skills local employers need.
- *Share* the regional career pathways with all education and training partners to influence program and curriculum development.
- *Recognize* the partners that elect to align and support regional career pathways.
- *Engage* education and training partners in an industry-led conversation that ensures students move seamlessly through support programs, educational institutions, training opportunities, and work-based experiences to build skills and credentials that meet industry demands.
