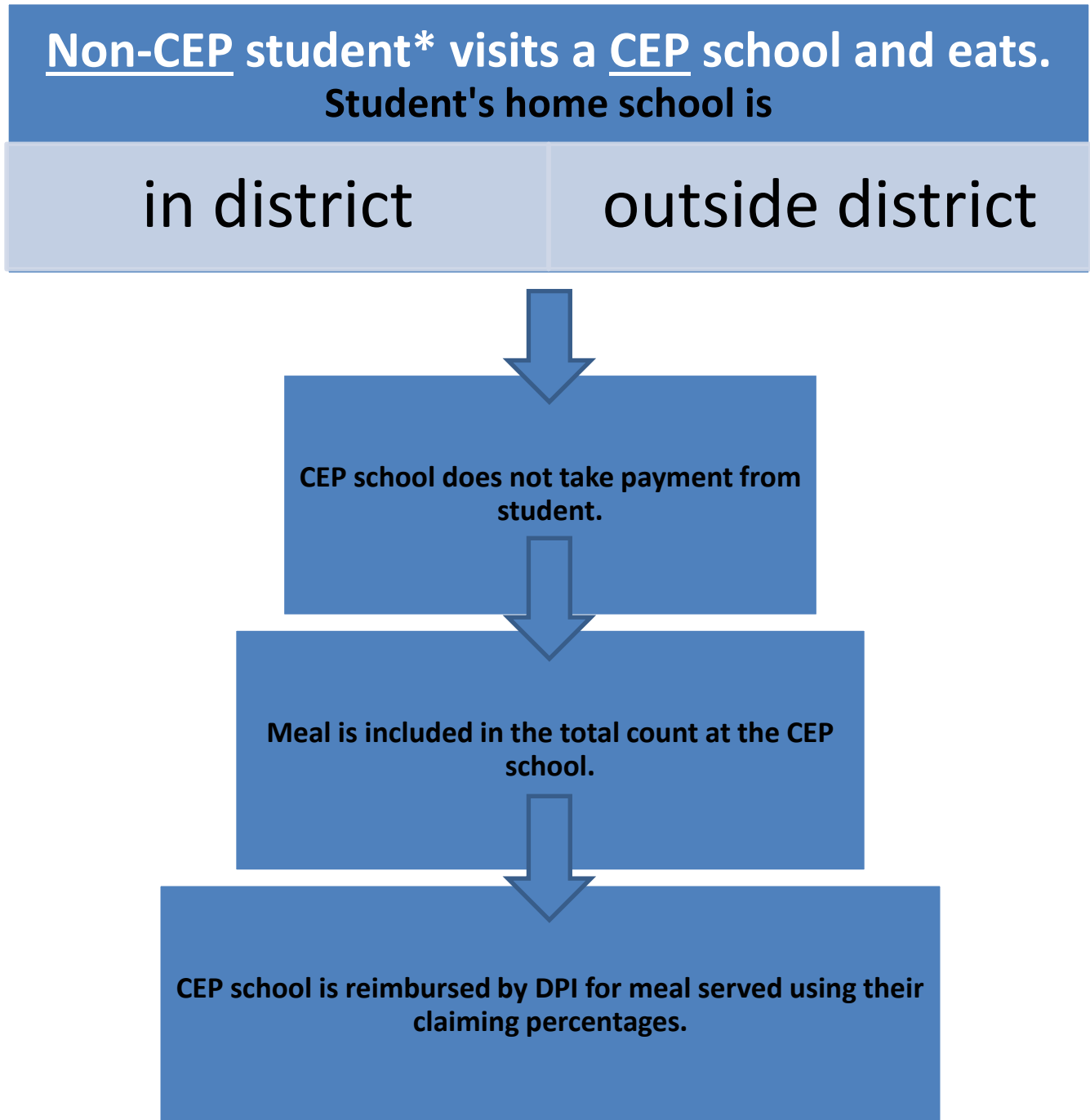


Visiting Students Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

Reference: USDA CEP Planning and Implementation Guidance, January 2016.



*Visiting students are considered *school age students*. Non-school aged children cannot be claimed for reimbursement. Non-school aged children need to be charged a la carte or the adult meal price to cover the full cost of the meal as a non-program food.
