

**Sunland, Inc. Expanded Recall of Peanut Butter
100396, Smooth Peanut Butter, 5-lb Containers
Recall/Destruction/Replacement/Reimbursement Information**

I. Recall Scope

An expanded recall has been released for products from Sunland, Inc. produced from March 1, 2010 to April 30, 2012 (Best-If-Used-By dates of March 1, 2011 to April 30, 2013).

The recall affects the following USDA Foods product:

- Peanut Butter, Smooth, 6/5 lb (100396 / B473)
 - UPC: 4868726704
 - Brand: Sunland Creamy Peanut Butter

II. Destruction and Disposal Instructions:

School Sites – Disposal of product

All Sunland, Inc. products included in the recall must be destroyed within seven days of this notice and cannot be used or reconditioned for human consumption.

Disposal of product in open containers:

Opened containers of the product, or any foods made with the product, should be discarded. An open container of food should be disposed of in the following manner:

- 1) Place the open container in a sealable plastic bag.
- 2) Place the sealed plastic bag containing the open product container inside two additional plastic bags and then tightly tape the bags closed.
- 3) Place the sealed/taped plastic bags containing the opened product in a secure trash receptacle for non-recyclable trash.

Do not discard any of these products in a sink, garbage disposal, or toilet.

Wash hands thoroughly after handling suspect food or containers.

- Destruction must be witnessed by 2 people: a person of authority (such as a food service director or designee, or state or local health official) and one other person.
- Both witnesses must sign a destruction verification document.
- The type of product, quantity, and destruction method must be noted.

Disposal of 25 cases or less:

You should immediately destroy quantities of 25 cases or less of USDA-purchased recalled Sunland products **on site**. This product must be rendered unfit for human consumption according to destruction guidance from your State or local health authority.

Product should **not** be disposed of by placing it in an unsecured garbage can, dumpster, or other receptacle in a manner that could result in subsequent removal by individuals for their own use, or for sale to others.

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Wash hands thoroughly after handling suspect food or containers.

- Destruction must be witnessed by 2 people: a person of authority (such as a food service director) and one other person.
- Both witnesses must sign a destruction verification document.
- The type of product, quantity, and destruction method must be noted.

Disposal of more than 25 cases:

Large quantities of product must be taken to a landfill, incinerated, or sent for inedible rendering.

- Destruction must be witnessed by 2 people: a person of authority (such as a food service director) and one other person.
- Both witnesses must sign a destruction verification document.
- The type of product, quantity, and destruction method must be noted.

III. Replacement:

Sunland Inc. has agreed to replace product, more details on how the replacement will occur will be issued in a separate document.

IV. Reimbursement Issues: All USDA Foods have the same reimbursable and non-reimbursable expense guidance.

Reimbursable Expenses

The following are reimbursable expenses:

- Delivery Fees
- Storage Fees (a maximum of 2 weeks)
- Transportation to disposal site (if more than 25 cases)
- Destruction

All reimbursable expenses MUST have accompanying receipts (trip tickets, landfill charges, distributor invoice, etc).

Non-reimbursable Expenses

The following are examples of, but not limited to, non-reimbursable expenses

- Storage at school level
- Overtime compensation for employees
- Long-distance phone calls and other associated administrative expenses
- Reimbursement for commercially-purchased food used in place of the recalled product

REMEMBER: Document all of your destruction costs associated with this recall.
