National School Lunch Program (NSLP)

The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) is a federally assisted meal program operating in more than 94,000 public and nonprofit private schools and residential child care institutions. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free lunches to more than 32 million children each school day. It was established under the National School Lunch Act and signed by President Harry Truman in 1946.

A4: Yes, with the new Professional Standards Rule it is required that each staff member complete a certain number of Continuing Education Units (CEUs). Both the person teaching the Civil Rights Training and the participants can count this towards their yearly requirements of CEUs.
