General Q&As

Q: When are you going to have the list out of who is up for AR in 2016-2017

A: We don't want to make any promises, but hope to have the list ready in a few months.

SNACs Q&As

Q: When will there be training for the SNACS program? I know you said summer, but are dates solidified, yet or to come?

A: There isn't a date set yet for training for SNACS. Training dates and locations to come. Training will be made available to the SFA's that have committed to using SNACS. There will also be tutorial videos posted on our website later this spring as well as a webinar to demonstrate some of the functions of SNACS. There is also support available here at DPI on an ongoing basis for those using SNACS.

Q: What if we are currently using Nutrikids? Will we still need to use the SNACs?

A: At this time the only module of SNACS that will be required will be the Administrative Review Module. Some SFA's will be selected to use SNACS for their 2016-2017 Administrative Review and eventually all SFA's will be using SNACS for their Administrative Review. By using SNACS for the Administrative Review it will cut down on the amount of time DPI needs to spend on-site, it will improve communication with DPI, and it will make the overall process more efficient.

Q: What modules are included in SNACS?

A: The Modules included in SNACS are: Eligibility and Certifications, Student Management, Counting and Claiming, and Reviews

Q: How will SNACs mesh with Wordware?

A: SNACS can be integrated with existing software. We are working closely with software vendors to ensure that data can be imported in SNACS easily.

Procurement Q&As

Q: Are there sample written procurement procedures on the website?

A: We are working on developing a complete set of sample procurement procedures. We should have it ready this summer (2016).

Q: Does that procurement tool help us evaluate our current procurement procedures?

A: Short answer is yes; the procurement tool is meant to review a SFA procurement process as well as contract management. One of the questions in the procurement tool asks if the SFA has procurement procedures. When answering this question, DPI will review SFA's procurement procedures for compliance with local, state, and federal regulations.
