

## Calculating Tuition for Non-resident student attending Summer Session 2020-2021

### Calculation Tuition for Non-Resident Student Attending Summer Session

**Parent-Paid Tuition:** A district may charge a parent tuition for a student it is not legally obligated to educate (e.g. out-of-state residents, students who have "aged out"). By law ([s. 121.81](#)) the payment uses the base transfer amount for Open Enrollment. If the student has a disability then the district would use a "Base Transfer Plus" tuition agreement as described above.

Here is the open enrollment information for the **2020-2021** school year.

Regular Education Basic Rate - \$8,125 per year, **\$45.14 per day**

1 Summer FTE Minutes per year	Days per standard (O.E.) school year	Minutes per regular school day
48,600	180	270

Open Enrollment daily Rate	Minutes per regular school day	Summer tuition per minute of Enrollment
\$ 45.14	270	\$ 0.1672

**Enrollment is** minutes of enrollment per course for all courses taken during the summer session (Step 1, below).

**To determine the tuition rate during a summer session;**

1. Based on the non-resident student's registration for summer session, calculate the minutes of enrollment the student is schedule to attend throughout the summer session.

**Minutes of enrollment per course = Minutes of instruction per course times number of days scheduled per course.** (Repeat for each course the student registered to take.) Sum the minutes of enrollment for all courses.

Course	Days scheduled	Minutes per day	Minutes of Enrollment
1	15	45	675
2	15	60	900
3	15	45	675
<b>Total Minutes of Enrollment =</b>			<b>2,250</b>

2. Multiply the total number of minutes calculated in step 1 and multiply by the "summer tuition per minute of attendance" rate in the chart above.

Total Minutes of Enrollment per student	Summer tuition per minute of Enrollment	Summer Session Tuition per student
2,250	\$ 0.1672	\$ 376.16
