OEA Timeline

- **Preliminary secure release: Monday, September 26**
 - Report cards available in the Secure Access File Exchange (SAFE)
 - Embargoed until public release
 - Initiates a one-week report card inquiry process (forms due October 3rd)
 - Please review your report cards EARLY
 - Inquiries and manual corrections take time
- **Public release: Monday, October 31**
 - Available on DPI website: <http://dpi.wi.gov/accountability/report-cards>



Accessing Preliminary Secure Report Cards

- Secure preliminary report cards are housed in SAFE
 - Choice school administrators are authorized to access the report cards in SAFE. They can also delegate access to others in their school using the Application Security Manager (ASM).

Preliminary Secure Report Cards

- They are both preliminary and secure.
 - The data are NOT redacted or suppressed in secure report cards.
 - Individual student information could be derived from these report cards.
 - The data or information on these report cards should never be shared with the media or public – even after the embargo is lifted.
- Public report cards are okay to share.



Accountability Report Cards

4 Priority Areas

1. Student Achievement
 - ELA and Mathematics Proficiency
 - Assessments used: WKCE, Badger, Forward, ACT, WAA-SwD, DLM
 - NO Aspire or WorkKeys
2. Student Growth
 - School and district level
 - No student level growth
3. Closing Gaps
 - Subgroup Performance
 - graduation gaps (new: six year graduation gaps)
4. On-Track to Graduation & Postsecondary Readiness
 - Attendance (K-8) and/or graduation rates
 - ELA (3rd grade), math (8th grade)

Report card calculations require at least two years of data. 2015-16 choice school report cards will not have any priority area scores or an overall score.

3 Student Engagement Indicators

Test Participation (>95%)
Absenteeism Rate (<13%)
Dropout Rate (<6%)



Choice School Report Cards: What to Expect

- Report card calculations require two or more years of data
 - Result: No priority area or overall scores for choice school report cards
- Choice school data in 2015-16 report cards:
 - Demographics (front page)
 - Proficiency rates on state assessments (front page)
 - Disaggregated assessment results for 2015-16 in these priority areas:
 - Achievement, Closing Gaps, On-Track

Header

- School name
- City | Private – Choice Students

Not Rated

- Asterisk clarifies reason for Not Rated

Demographics

- Enrollment = choice students
- Percent choice enrollment not available this year

Proficiency rates

- School reporting in for full academic year tested students only



Inquiry Process

- Choice Pupil Report card data were either submitted via WISEdata or come from the Wisconsin Student Assessment System (WSAS).
- During the secure release, schools have an opportunity to review report card data and initiate an inquiry process if there are data to be changed.
- Key points about the inquiry process:
 - It is critical to **submit an inquiry form** before October 3rd to start the process.
 - Any data **changes require evidence** submitted to OEA.
 - Any changes are *only* reflected in the report card and would not affect any other public reporting.
 - It is important that you review WISEdata before submission.
