

Accountability for Choice Schools 2020-21 School Year



Choice Pupil Report Cards

- All choice schools receive a report card based upon *only* the students attending with a voucher.
 - Requires at least 20 tested students, who were enrolled for the full academic year.
 - Report cards for new schools (in their 1st year), or schools that don't meet the minimum data requirement, say “Not Rated.”

Accountability Report Cards

- Four Priority Areas:
 - Student Achievement
 - School Growth
 - Closing Gaps (achievement and graduation rate)
 - On-Track (achievement and attendance or graduation rate)
- Two Student Engagement Indicators:
 - Absenteeism
 - Dropout rate

Private School Report Cards

- Schools may opt-in to receive an *additional* report card, based upon *all students* in the school.
- If you opt in:
 - Have WISEids for all students
 - WISEdata submissions for all students
 - Test all students
- We provide Private School Report Cards once we have *two consecutive years* of data for all students in the school.

Report card timelines

- **Two releases:** Secure and Public
- **Secure** release in Oct
 - Via a secure log-in site (SAFE)
 - Non-redacted data – should never be shared.
 - Internal review, opportunity to open an inquiry for data corrections
- **Public** release: Oct/Nov
 - Final release – no more data inquiries

Schools new to the choice program in 2020-21 will receive their first report card(s) in the fall of 2021. Those report cards will be Not Rated because we will only have one year of data for the school. The first scored report cards will come in the fall of 2022.
