

**Pupil Nondiscrimination Self-Evaluation:
Supplemental Instructions for Districts which have Participated in the On-site
Civil Rights Compliance Review Process
(January, 2017)**

Staff from the Department of Public Instruction's Career and Technical Education (CTE) team complete on-site Civil Rights Compliance Reviews for a selected number of school districts each school year. Districts which have recently participated in the onsite Civil Rights Compliance Review process may use the CTE team report and district corrective action plan to meet, in part, the evaluation and reporting requirements of PI 9.06 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code.

Through participation in the CTE Civil Rights Compliance Review, your district will have most likely met the data collection requirements of PI 9.06(1)(c) ("Methods, practices, curriculum and materials used in ... counseling... partially met the data collection requirements of PI 9.06(1)(e) ("Participation trends and patterns and school district support of athletic, **extracurricular and recreational activities**"), and most likely met the data collection requirements of PI 9.06(1)(f) ("Trends and patterns in awarding scholarships and other forms of recognition and achievement provided or administered by the district").

To fully meet the requirements of PI 9.06(1), you will need to evaluate the following area:

- "Participation trends and patterns and school district support of athletic ... activities."

Wisconsin state law protects students from discrimination on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. Federal law protects students from discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, ethnicity, sex, and disability. Therefore and in order to evaluate the status of nondiscrimination and equality of educational opportunity in the school district, you may need to evaluate fully the three required content areas with respect to students in all protected classes.

As PI 9.06(3), Wis. Admin. Code, requires a written report of the evaluation which shall be available for examination by residents of the school district, you may wish to collate the existing Civil Rights Compliance Review report, corrective action plan, and any new data and analysis into one document.
