<p>Involves:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Relating with adults • Relating with other children • For older children, following rules related to groups or interacting with others  <p>Includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attachment, separation and autonomy • Expressing emotions and feelings • Learning rules and expectations • Social interactions and play 	<p>Involves:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Thinking, reasoning, remembering and problem solving • Using symbols and language • Understanding the physical and social worlds <p>Includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Early concepts (symbols, pictures, numbers, classification, spatial relationships) • Imitation • Object permanence • Expressive language and communication • Early literacy 	<p>Involves:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Taking care of basic needs • Getting from place to place • Using tools (e.g., fork, toothbrush, crayon) • In older children, contributing to their own health and safety  <p>Includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Integrating motor skills to complete tasks • Self-help skills (e.g., dressing, feeding, grooming, toileting, household responsibility) • Acting on the world to get what one wants
