In the Matter of An Appeal Filed with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by Mr. and Mrs. William A. [REDACTED] Dated October 7, 1968, Appealing from the Expulsion of James A. [REDACTED] from the Williams Bay High School, Williams Bay, Wisconsin.

O R D E R

Upon the above captioned appeal, made pursuant to Section 120.13 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a hearing was duly held thereon, and the matter was taken under advisement immediately thereafter. Pending the decision of the undersigned State Superintendent, the appellant commenced an action in the United States District Court for the Western District of Wisconsin, the action being numbered 68-C-301. In the complaint, served upon the undersigned on December 16, 1968, it is alleged that James A. [REDACTED], the subject of this appeal, has cut his hair and is now back in school.

WHEREFORE, THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT ORDERS that this proceeding be and hereby is terminated as moot, for the reason that the expulsion was to end upon compliance by James A. [REDACTED] with the rule alleged to have been violated by him, and he has now complied therewith, as shown by said complaint, reference to which is hereby expressly made.
